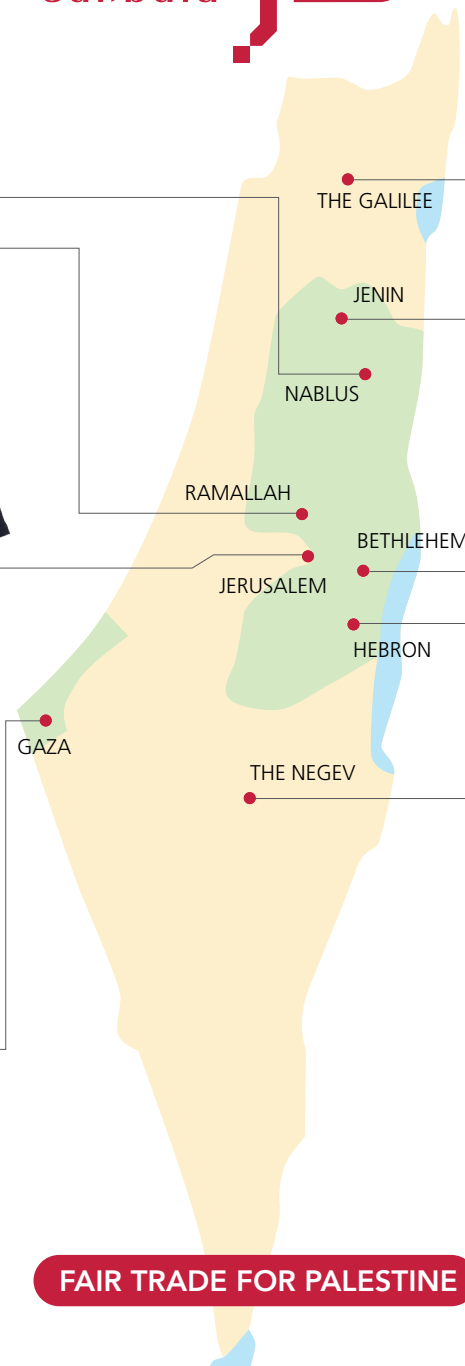

At the same time, Sunbula works to preserve and revitalize the cultural heritage of Palestine.

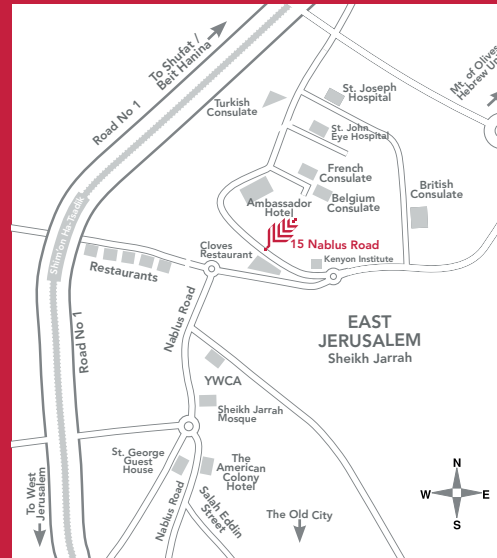

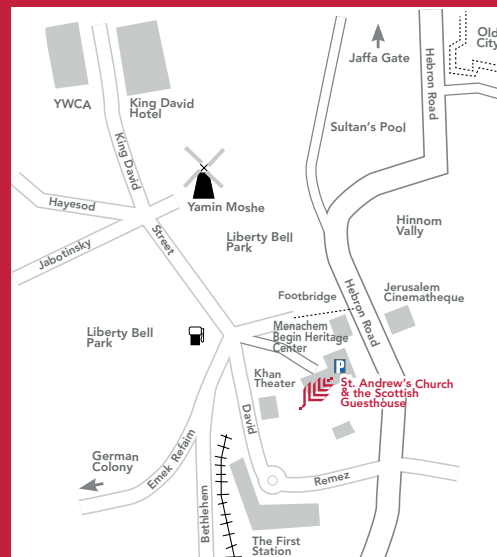

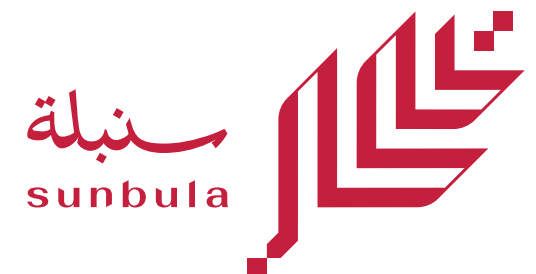
