Mission & Vision :

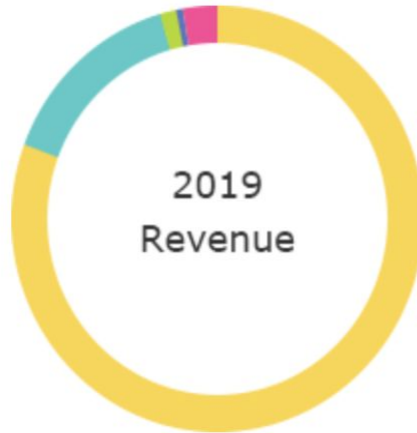
