Stationery, Sanitary Pads and Learning Materials for Schools

Learners and teachers in the 6 schools that we support will have the critical resources that they need to succeed, such as stationery packs, teaching materials, daily meals for learners, and sanitary pads to keep girls in school.

Back to school box per learner: \$100

Sanitary pads for the year for 1 school: \$1,000

Stationery for learners: \$5,000

Teaching materials: \$2,500



School Renovations at Mambanje Primary School

We will complete renovations on new kitchen for Mambanje Primary School to assist with the preparation and cooking of meals for the learners. The kitchen will be fully equipped with running water, sinks, pots, utensils, and a storeroom. Additionally,

We will be building a dining shelter, so learners have a comfortable space to sit during meal times. The nutrition program serves 2 healthy meals to learners daily. It is vital in supporting the academic progress of learners by helping them focus and concentrate in class.

Furnishing the kitchen: \$5,000

School Renovations at Maunga Primary School

We are expanding Maunga Primary School into a primary and secondary school. The nearest secondary school is 12 miles (20km) from Maunga Village. The high cost of schooling, travel, and boarding far from home is a financial challenge for many families. As a result, a large percentage of learners for Maunga and the surrounding villages drop out of school after grade 7. Expanding Maunga Primary School will keep learners in school beyond grade 7, giving them the opportunity to finish their schooling while easing the financial burden for parents. The expansion plan will require key improvements, including a fully equipped science lab, additional classrooms, a new dormitory, and additional teacher accommodation at the school.

This year, we will start renovating the science lab.

Science Lab: \$35,000

Science Equipment: \$7,000



School Renovations at Khwai Pre-School

We are expanding Khwai Pre-School and building an additional classroom block for the school. Khwai Pre-School provides early childhood development and education for 40 learners between the ages of 1 and 5. Learners receive early childhood development education, daily nutrition meals and stationery and learning materials supplied by the foundation to equip them for success.

The expansion of the school will allow us to add a 3rd classroom block to the school, increasing the school capacity to take in more learners. The school currently accommodates

School Renovations at Janeiro Primary School

ABCF has been supporting Janeiro Primary School since 2024. To date, we are providing stationery, textbooks, learning materials, and sanitary pads to keep girls in school. Additionally, we have refurbished the classrooms, repaired the roof, windows, doors and repainted the classrooms.

ABCF will continue renovations at Janeiro Primary School in 2025. We will provide new desks and chairs for the classrooms and upgrade the boarding facilities and dormitories. Learners are currently sleeping on the floor, without bedding (especially during winter). We will provide beds and beddings for the dormitories at the school.

Renovating the hostel: \$10,000

Beds and mattresses for hostels: \$6,000

Female Scouts & Female Guides

ABCF and Lolebezi is supporting **7 Kufadza female scouts**

The Kufadza female scouts are an all-female group of highly trained scouts who are at the frontline of our efforts to mitigate human-wildlife conflict. The scouts play a vital role in protecting wildlife and educating local communities on the importance of conservation.

5 female guides will join the program in 2025.

Our Female Guides Program is transforming the safari industry and creating opportunities for women in guiding. This two-year program provides comprehensive training to empower women, through access to career opportunities in a traditionally male-dominated field. Over the past four years, we've trained more than 20 aspiring female guides.

Erecting Lion Bomas To Protect Livestock

The Lion Boma are vital in protecting livestock, reducing human-wildlife conflict, and preventing retaliatory killings of wild animals. A boma is a cloth material used to cover kraals (wooden livestock pens), preventing predators from seeing the animals inside.

This year, we will install 20 additional lion bomas in Mola and Mambanje village

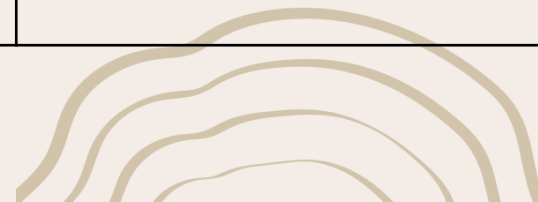
