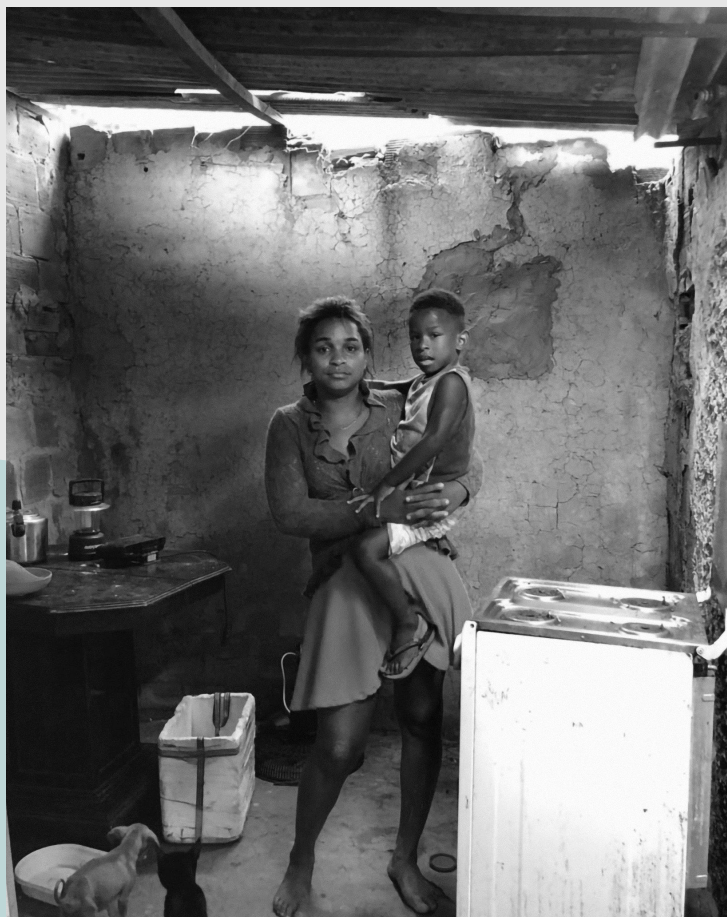

HABITABLE HOUSING



There is a strong relationship between housing and public health. Lack of basic sanitation, ventilation and clean water in early childhood can compromise a child's physical and cognitive development and can even result in fatalities.

However, housing with good lighting and clean drinking water promotes education and decreases hospitalizations.



Challenge



Our challenge is to make it possible for 20 families to live in basic conditions such as running water, sewage, safe electrical installations, and windows.

Decent homes can become the essential foundation for people to build happy, dignity lives.

The estimated budget for each house is US\$3,000.



OUR MAIN PILLARS

To fulfill its mission, Dara Institute

- It directly serves, at its headquarters in Rio de Janeiro, families in situations of social vulnerability, with the social technology called PAF;
- Disseminates acquired knowledge, mainly through national and international consultancies;
- Stimulates the replication of the PAF and research in the academic environment;
- Works to influence public policies; and mobilize civil society: more than 1600 volunteers have worked at the institution.



WHERE WE ARE



In **30** years, more than **75** thousand people have been served directly, and **1 million** indirectly in **4 continents**, through the work of organizations that are inspired by our social technology.

Partnership with the municipality of Belo Horizonte, since 2009. In 2021, in Brasília, we signed a technical cooperation agreement with the Ministry of Citizenship.

The transfer of social technology is currently underway to the University of Maryland, in the United States, and to the Girls Move organization, in Mozambique.
