

Project needs

- On the 24th of February 2022, Russia invaded Ukraine.
 Millions of Ukrainians have to face a two-sided war: the
 war outside, with real soldiers, bombs and air raids, and
 the war with a disease. The wounded. The chronically
 ill. Their families. The medical staff.
- The medical resources were less and less, while the requests for help were increasing every day.
- A month after the war began, the World Health Organization identified 64 hospitals that had been attacked, including children's hospitals and maternities.











The Emergency Fund for Ukraine

- There are those who leave. But there are also those who stay. For those who stay, both patients and wounded, we have created the Emergency Fund for Ukraine.
- We have identified the needs in the hospitals (necessity lists) in order to offer efficient support.
- We have collaborated with Ukrainian volunteers and signed partnerships with the Ukrainian local authorities, for collection and distribution.
- We have raised funds from our donors and sponsors in order to purchase medicine, supplies and medical devices and transport them to Ukraine.


When: March 4, 2022

What we sent:

- Medical supplies: +270,000 pcs. (syringes, needles, medical masks, compresses)
- Painkillers: +14,000 pcs. (capsules, vials, powders for injectable solutions)
- Anti-inflammatories: +10,000 pcs. (capsules, creams, gels)
- Chronic disease drugs: +10,000 boxes
- Antibiotics: 1,578 boxes
- Anaesthetics: 423 pcs. (spray, vials, powders for injectable solutions)

Where they ended up: Chernivtsi, Kyiv and hospitals with urgent needs in the areas affected by the war.







2 trucks, 37 pallets, 8 tonnes

To: Special Medical Offer Base Municipal Institution within the Transcarpathian State Regional Office, Uzhhorod

When: March 16, 2022

What we sent:

- Hospital and surgical supplies (compresses, catheters, tubes, perfusion kits): + 25,000 units / pcs.
- First aid instruments and equipment (stretchers, splints, bandages, resuscitation kits): + 21,000 units / pcs.
- Protective equipment (masks, gloves): + 10,200 pcs.
- General disinfectants: 2,500 l
- Surgical disinfectants: 1,000 l
- Emergency medicine: 2,057 units
- Chronic disease medicine: 120 boxes
- Beds: 17 pcs.

Where they ended up: 3 major hospitals in Kyiv.

2 trucks, 24 pallets, 3 tonnes

To: The Dunayev Town Council of the Kamianets-Podilsk District in the Hmelnytsk Region, Dunaivtsi

When: April 1, 2022

What we sent:

- Medical instruments: +84,000 pcs. (forceps, scissors, perfusion kits)
- Antibiotics: +8,000 boxes
- Anti-inflammatories: 2,984 pcs. (tablets, creams, gels)
- Disinfectants: 1,602 pcs. (solutions, ointments)
- First aid supplies: 68 pcs. (mats, stretchers, wheelchairs)
- Vaccines: 230 pcs
- Vitamins: 480 boxes
- Oncological drugs: 280 boxes
- Painkillers: 17 boxes

Where they ended up: Kiyv + the Dunaivtsi, Kharkiv, Zaporizhia, Cherkasy, Khmelnytsky regions.

When: May 12, 2022

What we sent:

- Medical supplies: +36,000 pcs. (surgical kits, gloves, gowns, alcohol)
- Tactical / first aid supplies: 1,336 pcs. (stretchers, cervical collars, bandages and sterile band-aids)
- Medical / army tents: 12 pcs.
- Medical equipment: 9 pcs. (monitors, defibrillators)

Where they ended up: Azov Battalion of Kyiv, Hospitallers organisation, Kharkiv and other areas with urgent medical needs.





1 truck, 9 pallets, 1 tonne

To: Ukraine XXI Charitable Foundation

When: July 19, 2022

What we sent:

- Chronic disease medication: 3,791 pcs.
- Anxiolytics, sedatives: 604 pcs.
- Anti-inflammatories: 537 pcs.
- Osteosynthesis set + external fixation systems for fractures: 500 pcs.
- Pharmaceutic supplements: 457 pcs.
- Antidiabetics: 298 pcs.
- Antihistamines: 225 pcs.
- Antibiotics: 159 pcs.
- Wheelchairs: 20 pcs.

Where they ended up: Kharkiv, Kyiv and other areas with urgent medical needs.






