1. Summary

- Isla and Emma hosted an Empowering Girls workshop on gender equality at Adenkrebi school.

- The students enthusiastically engaged in this session and asked many questions at the end to help clarify what they have learnt. Some of the questions asked were:
 - *'why should men and women be equal?'*
 - *'what is the difference between stereotypes and equality?'*
 - *'what should you do if someone is practicing gender inequality?'*
 - *'why can't boys cook?'*
 - *and others asked for clarification around gender inequality*
