2	Project description	<p>The proposed project seeks to address the issue of land ownership among the poor women community in Karatu District. Due to lack of land ownership the target group faces persistent food insecurity because they don't have the confidence to invest in land fertility improvement or to use the land as collateral. Women's access to land and property is central to women's economic empowerment, therefore, TAJPI will facilitate Land formalization and acquisition of Title Deeds to 100 women. The project will be implemented for the duration of nine (9) months in the District of Karatu.</p> <p>The project will have the following specific objectives;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. To enhance community awareness of land ownership rights by women in Karatu district. ii. To increase the number of women in Karatu District with land title deeds as evidence of improved women access to, and control over landresource in the district <p>TAJPI anticipates that, after successfully execution of the project, the following results will occur;</p> <p>Immediate Results</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. <p>4</p>	<p>Implementation arrangements</p>	<p>The Office of The Executive Director will be responsible for the overall coordination of the implementation of the project through a Project Coordinating Committee (PCC) which would comprise of Program Coordinator, Training Coordinator, M&E Coordinator and Finance and Administration Coordinator.</p> <p>A steering committee will also be established to be responsible for periodic monitoring of project activities as well as providing technical guidance to the implementation of the project among others. This committee will comprise of PCC team, 3 local leaders, 3 representatives from women, 2 representatives of local community based organizations and 3 officers from District Council.</p> <p>Selection of this modality is based on its effectiveness in ensuring the project acceptance to the stakeholders as well building the sense of ownership of the project to the stakeholders.</p>
