Since 2015 LEAP has helped over 250 young talents to become change agent in the oikos community and beyond by equipping them with the necessary competencies, qualities, practices, tools and global network to become conscious leaders in the co-creation of thriving and sustainable societies.

Within this initiative we have developed 4 different programs:

- **LEAP YOUth:** Intense 10-month personal and leadership development journey.
- **LEAP Researchers:** 9-month program for early career researchers
- **LEAP Life:** for LEAP Alumni & Volunteers from all programs to continue their development.
- **LEAP Tools:** a living set of resources and guides to help facilitate conscious leadership at the local level.

LEAP is a 10-month program including a summer break in July and is held in English with most elements being online. Every 2 months participants tackle a different dimension of the Inner Development Goals. They always get Input Materials and receive an input webinar to create a picture of what is there to learn. Then they reflect on their learnings with their Peer Groups, their 1:1 Coach and by themselves before diving into practical applications with a workshop. Finally they embed the learned into their live and evaluate how it helped them to become a more conscious leader.

The LEAP program uses a rich scaffolding of theories, concepts, methods, tools and practices to foster conscious leadership in the context of transformation for sustainability.

The Inner Development Goals (IDG) refer to the skills and qualities needed as a leader to successfully work with complex societal issues, particularly those identified in UNs Agenda 2030 and the 17 Sustainable Development Goals.
