Report - May 2025

In February, we launched a new cycle of our Feminist and Popular Political Education School. This year, our efforts are focused on deepening the training of grassroots women leaders, strengthening their roles as educators and facilitators within their communities.



Our methodology

To guide this process, we structured the year into three core learning modules. Each one addresses a fundamental skill we believe is essential to building strong, transformative educators:

- 1. Trust** – Cultivating self-trust and building meaningful, supportive relationships with others.
- 2. Active Listening** – Developing the ability to listen with empathy, reciprocity, and respect, fostering deeper connections and understanding.
- 3. Cooperation** – Learning to work collectively, supporting one another, and recognizing the diverse strengths that each woman brings to the group.



As part of this year's activities, in May we supported the Women's Commission of UDAPT (Union of People Affected by Texaco) in strengthening trust among their members and facilitating collective reflection on the environmental challenges affecting the communities they represent.
