


THE PROBLEM

192 schools built, with 993 classrooms

138,000 kids in school each year

RISE builds critical infrastructure, a fundamental starting point, to give children access to education. Centrally located within the community, the schools are quality structures with gender-specific toilets and access to clean water, creating inclusive and equitable places of protection and safety. Students are more engaged, able to concentrate, and focus on their studies.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE . . .

- The successful completion of our co-funding partnership with Educate A Child and ExxonMobil. The project began in 2017 and exceeded all targets 26 schools were built, 28,784 out-of-school children were enrolled, and our Monitoring & Evaluation team collected detailed data on the 28,784 individual students.
- The dedication and handover of seven schools. At Bolonguera, a remote location where there had never been a school, the Mayor gratefully shared that "without RISE we could not move forward."
 Beautiful new schools at Cassualala, Calombinda, Kwawa, Cabaia,
 11th of November, and Lonjombele were dedicated with celebration, joy, and gratitude.





- The drilling of wells and access to clean water at Denda and Bairro Novo, funded by Rotary.
- The creation of jobs for building teams, teachers and staff, which serve as a stimulus to the local economy, and a valuable provision amid high unemployment countrywide.





WORKING TOGETHER TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE . . .

Fundraising efforts included a Brewery Tour, Fantasy Football leagues, GlobalGiving campaigns, Team RISE marathon runners, and school events, which all raised money to give kids the chance to go to school. Our annual benefit, at Sketchbook Brewing Co., was a night of celebration and challenge. Funds were donated to build a 10-classroom school at Bairro Novo where over 1000 kids have no access to education. The first stone was laid and construction began.






SOURCE OF INCOME 2021




INCOME AND EXPENSE COMPARISON 2014-2021
