THE SURF INDUSTRY



Our workshops focus on eco-friendly surfboards, from a traditional Alaia to innovative, low-impact shaping techniques like vacuum construction. While these methods have challenges, we're committed to improving sustainability, performance and accessibility. Join us in reshaping the surf industry for a greener, cleaner future!

THE TECHNIQUE

The vacuum bagging method involves placing layers of materials, such as wood and cork with glue into a bag. Subsequently, a vacuum pump removes the air, creating uniform pressure that compresses and evenly distributes the materials, allowing them to cure and bond effectively, resulting in a strong and lightweight composite structure.

'Vacuum Construction,' now embraced by major surf brands is a method used to shape eco-friendly surfboards, eliminating the need for resins and fibreglass. These boards excel in weight, flexibility and durability even outperforming commercial options.

By ditching toxic resins, we address environmental concerns and tackle surf-related waste issues. Traditional boards lack recycling options, underscoring the need for sustainable alternatives. We'll focus on sourcing materials locally and recycling old boards. Our aim to integrate this technique into our workshops, elevating craft performance, sharing expertise and expanding wooden surfboard artistry in African coastal communities.





NEW SEEDS OF HOPE

We plan to implement a one month workshop in March 2024 in collaboration with Lwandi Surf, a nonprofit organisation centred on surf therapy and educational initiatives based in Ponta do Ouro, Mozambique. Manuel and Lwandi Surf will learn this novel technique from two professional eco-surfboard shapers, Sergi and Alberto.


