ABOUT THE PROJECT

In January 2018, recognizing the challenges faced by women in Machar Colony, Imkaan established a 24/7 maternity home within the community. The closest maternity home or hospital, located 45 minutes away, proved inaccessible due to transportation limitations, hindering women from consulting qualified midwives during pregnancies. Consequently, the community resorted to traditional birth attendants or dais for home births, resulting in complex situations and potential fatalities for either the mother or the child.

Imkaan's initiative aimed to decrease the infant mortality rate by providing a medically conducive environment for childbirth at their doorstep. This proactive measure ensures that women have access to proper medical care, addressing the critical needs of maternal and infant health in Machar Colony and aims to: Reduce the incidence of maternal and newborn mortality and morbidity in the area.

Facilitate communities to access quality skilled maternity care.

Provide post-natal and antenatal support to women of Machar Colony including awareness regarding nutritional needs.

Provide a delivery.

Create awareness regarding family planning and the importance of planned parenthood



DELIVERIES AT THE MATERNITY HOME


Due to poverty and the additional hurdle of lacking proper identification, women face barriers accessing government clinics and hospitals for childbirth. Private institutes are financially out of reach for them. Imkaan's maternity home offers a secure and medically suitable environment for giving birth.

Qualified midwives provide essential supervision and support throughout the gestation period and delivery, enabling antenatal care for the marginalized community women. This initiative aims to address the gap, ensuring safe and supported child birth for women confronting economic challenges and identity issues.



MANUAL VACCUM ASPIRATION

Due to early marriages, malnourishment, and multiple births, a significant number of miscarriages occur.

Imkaan's maternity home offers manual vacuum aspiration (MVA) services, removing tissue from the womb without general anesthetic. This procedure reduces the risks of infection, internal bleeding, and uterine damage.

From July to December 2023, a total of 5 MVAs were performed, addressing critical needs in maternal healthcare and reducing complications associated with miscarriages.









FAMILY PLANNING

The maternity home caters to families averaging to 10 children and facing seasonal 9 employment, offering a safe space for discussing family planning and spacing options.


In the community, early marriages are prevalent, and girls under 19 struggle to carry a child full term, exacerbated by malnourishment, leading to increased maternal and neonatal mortality rates.

Family planning safeguards women from health risks pre, during, and post-childbirth, such as high blood pressure, gestational diabetes, infections, miscarriage, and stillbirth, highlighting its crucial role in maternal and child health in underserved communities.




LABORATORY

Lab work is important for pregnant women to assess and monitor various health indicators. Blood tests can detect anemia, infections, and gestational diabetes. Urine tests help identify kidney problems and preeclampsia. These screenings aid in early detection of potential issues, allowing timely intervention for a safer pregnancy and healthier outcomes for both the mother and baby.


CONSULTATIONS

ULTRASOUND FACILITY

Imkaan's ultrasound room supports mother & child health clinic and the maternity home since 2014 and 2018 respectively. The ultrasound facility dedicated to reproductive & child health allows medical team to obtain:


- accurate diagnostic imaging for pregnant women and babies,
- fetal well-being and heart activity
- gestational age
- imaging for delivery assistance
- determine early on whether a woman is high-risk and experiencing complications
- devise life-saving solutions that can contribute to reducing maternal and perinatal mortality in our area.

The ultrasound facility has encouraged the women of the community to come to a health care facility for skilled antenatal care and delivery assistance instead of utilizing more traditional methods or consulting unqualified practitioners/quacks. November 275



No. of Patients Treated in 2023 (July - December)






Against the Odds: Natural Delivery Prevails Over Cesarean in Uterine Prolapse Case at Imkaan
