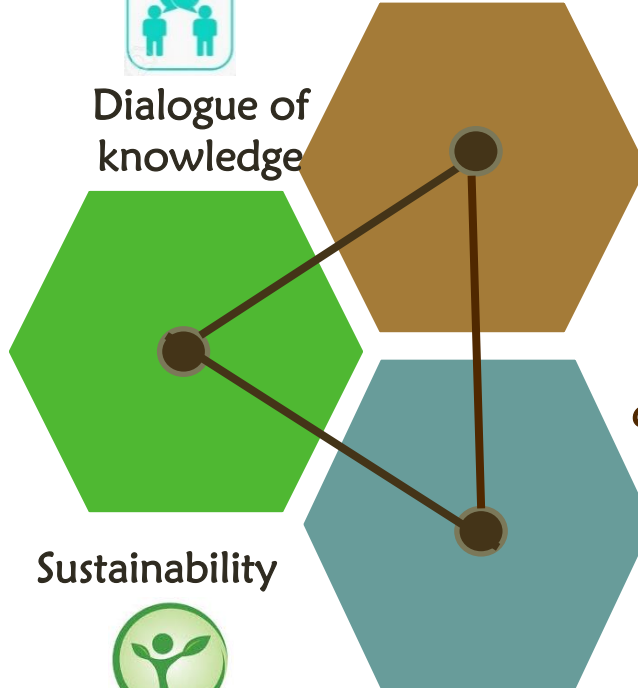

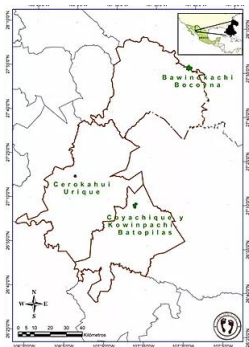

Project: Restoring rarámuri communities' territories

This project will contribute to the environmental restoration of two micro-watersheds in rarámuri indigenous communities in the Sierra Tarahumara in northern Mexico.

It aims to achieve this through the reforestation of 20,000 pine plants, generating employment for 30 families, conducting 3 workshops on hygiene and sanitation dialogue, conducting 1 community water diagnosis, providing training on the design and construction of 4 communal dry toilets. As a result, it will increase forest cover, improve the water quality of 4 springs, and simultaneously enhance the living conditions of 60 families."
