In November 2025, FESBAL—the Federation created by and to support Food Banks—celebrated its 30th anniversary: three decades of steadfast commitment to the fight against food insecurity and food waste, **ensuring sufficient, dignified and nutritious food** for people in vulnerable situations. Over these years, the Food Bank network has consolidated an effective solidarity-based model, grounded in collaboration and close ties to local communities, and capable of adapting to changing contexts.

The year 2025 once again proved demanding. The persistence of social vulnerability, inflation and economic uncertainty sustained a high demand for food assistance. In response, our commitment remained firm: **to leave no one behind**.

Thanks to the dedication of volunteers, companies, donors and social organizations, in 2025 we supported 930,412 people, distributing more than 106 million kilograms/litres of food—equivalent to 114 kilograms per person—through 5,789 charitable organizations. Behind every figure are stories of dignity restored through this **collective effort**.

During 2025, **PlanB** became firmly established as a comprehensive solution in the fight against food waste, aligned with the forthcoming implementation in April 2026 of the Food Loss and Waste Prevention Law (LPPDA).

In Addition, FESBAL's Emergency Committee continued to coordinate support for those affected by the DANA, with particular focus on the Valencia Food Bank and on medium- and long-term recovery processes.

We look ahead to 2026 with the certainty that, although challenges remain, **together we are stronger**. We will continue working to guarantee the right to dignified food, strengthening alliances and innovating with people always at the centre.

WHO WE ARE

The Spanish Federation of Food Banks (FESBAL) is a non-profit, apolitical, and non-denominational entity which, since 1995, represents, promotes, and supports the work of its associated Food Banks in their fight against poverty and food waste, through the recovery and distribution of food to people in vulnerable situations, while also contributing to improving environmental protection.

FESBAL is governed by principles of equality and transparency and is accredited by Fundación Lealtad.

In 2012, it was awarded the Prince of Asturias Award for Concord in recognition of its track record as a social organization.

FESBAL is an active member of the European Federation of Food Banks (FEBA) and serves on its Board of Directors. This federation brings together 351 Food Banks fighting hunger and poverty across 30 European countries.

During 2025, FESBAL and its 54 Food Banks distributed **106,307 tonnes** of food, reaching **930,412 people** in vulnerable situations. This achievement was made possible thanks to the commitment of a team of **3,319** people—mostly volunteers—who sustain daily operations, as well as the **96,926** volunteers who took part in the major food drives.

- **To design and implement** training and professional development programs aimed at fostering the social and labor integration of beneficiaries.

ABOUT FOOD BANKS

What are they?

Food Banks are non-profit organizations that help curb poverty by recovering surplus food to support people in vulnerable situations. In doing so, they also contribute to transforming the food system towards a fairer, more sustainable and environmentally responsible model.

How they work?

1 FOOD ACQUISITION

They obtain food through donations from private companies, industry surpluses, retail distribution chains, public institutions, and food drives. Additional purchases are made to ensure a balanced and nutritious diet.

2 STORAGE AND CLASSIFICATION

They receive food at their warehouses, where it is sorted for distribution among partner social organizations.

3 DISTRIBUTION

They distributed the food through a network of officially recognized social organizations, according to their needs and the groups they serve.

4 DELIVERY TO PEOPLE

They provide food assistance to the most vulnerable populations through social organizations.

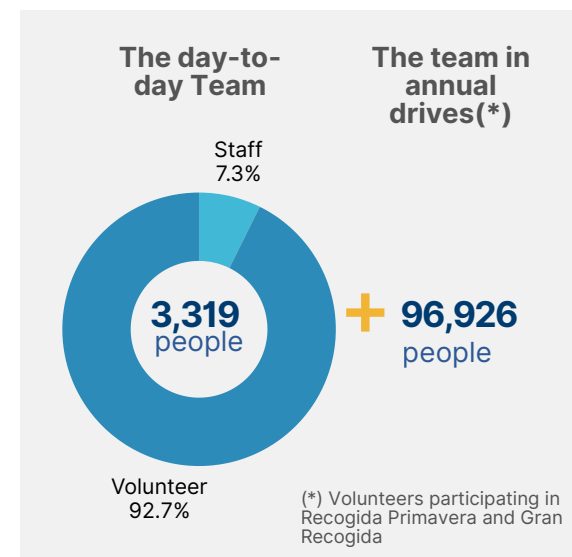
Volunteering is the soul that sustains the work of FESBAL and its 54 Food Banks in their fight against food waste and poverty.

Day-to-day operations are carried out by a team of **3,319 people**, 92.68% of whom are **volunteers** who place their talent and effort at the service of others.

They are joined by **96,926 people** who participate in major food drives, providing information in retail chains or supporting subsequent sorting activities in Food Bank warehouses.

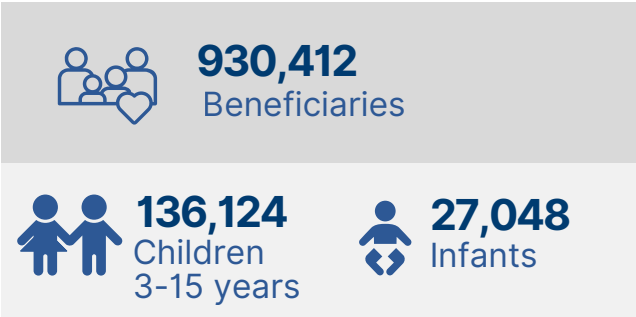

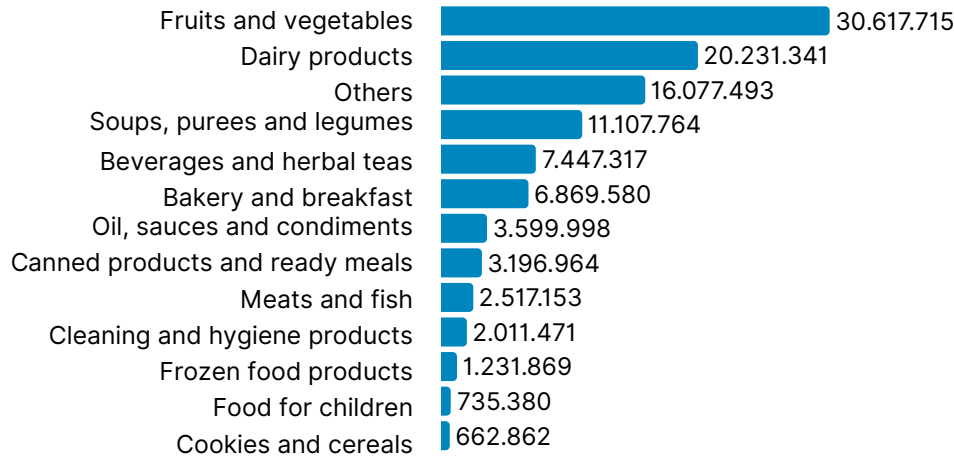
In 2025, the work of the 54 Food Banks and FESBAL enabled the distribution of **106,306,908 kilograms/litres** of food, helping to improve the quality of life of **930,412 people** in vulnerable situations across the country.

This work was made possible thanks to the collaboration of **5,789 certified social organizations**, which are responsible for delivering assistance directly to the people who benefit from it.

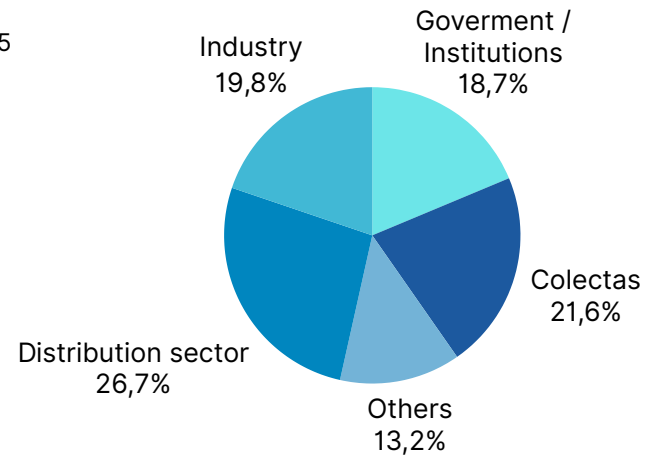

By product type

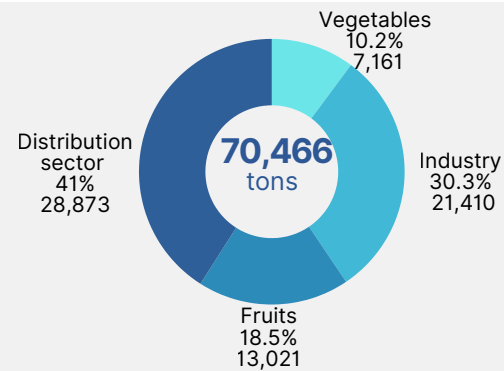


Per incoming channel

Surplus food

Over the past 30 years, the Food Banks associated with FESBAL have supported more than 26 million people during times of hardship.

During this period, a total of 2,598,910 tonnes of food were distributed; of this amount, 1,242,502 tonnes came from food surplus, helping to prevent waste and contributing to environmental protection.

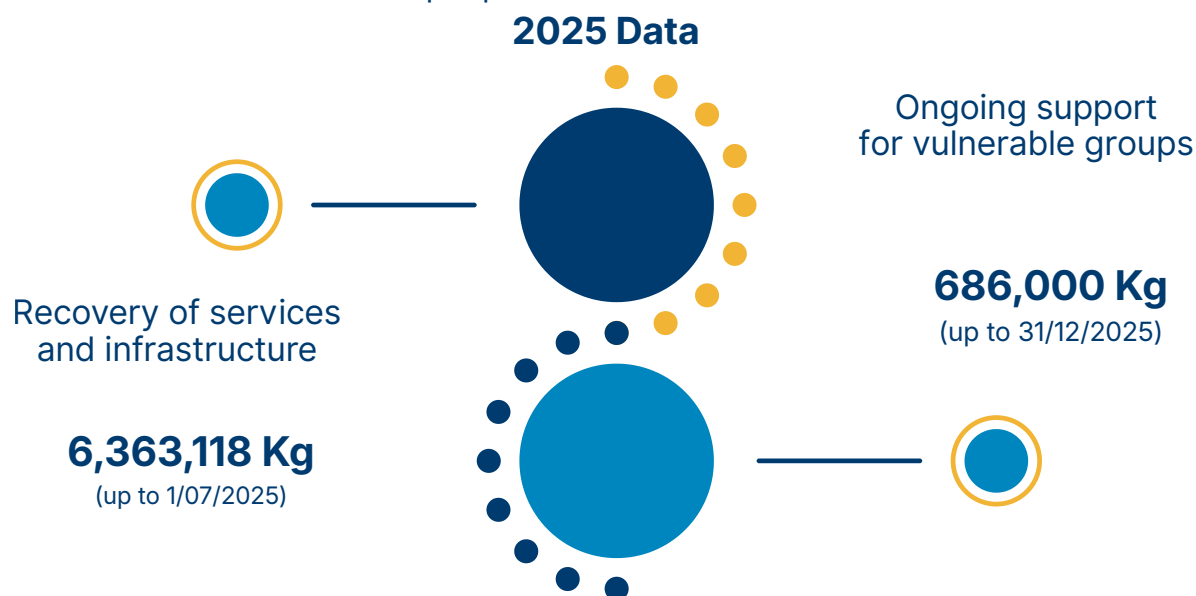
This effort is equivalent to more than 108,280 fully loaded food lorries: a chain of solidarity that, if aligned, would extend for 1,787 kilometres.



12 months of ongoing support

Following the activation of FESBAL's Emergency Committee in October 2024, the 54 associated Food Banks, together with the Federation, mobilised to provide an immediate response to the population affected by the DANA, distributing **5,820,000 kilograms** of food to address the initial emergency situation.

Throughout 2025, this support was sustained through the channelling of raised funds, which continued to be allocated to the Food Banks in the affected provinces—particularly the Valencia Food Bank—for the purchase and distribution of food to people in the most vulnerable situations.

Food recovery is key to tackling environmental impact



PlanB is the Food Banks' comprehensive project designed to optimise the management of surplus food and strengthen the response to vulnerable groups. Its aim is to create a **strong and efficient link** between donors, Food Banks and charitable organisations, maximising social impact through a technological and human platform that ensures **full traceability, regulatory compliance and the prevention of food waste**.

Food recovery is a **key strategy for reducing the environmental impact of the food system**. When food is discarded, all the resources used to produce, process, transport and store it are wasted. In addition, food recovery prevents the emissions that would otherwise be generated through the treatment of food waste in landfills, through incineration or via composting.

Throughout the year, nationwide awareness-raising and food collection campaigns are organised with the commitment of society to combat food poverty.

Recogida Primavera Gran Recogida

These initiatives accounted for **12.4%** of the food obtained by the 54 Food Banks associated with FESBAL, consolidating their role as a strategic pillar in ensuring a continuous food supply for people in vulnerable situations.

This impact was made possible primarily thanks to the involvement of **96,926 volunteers**. Their dedication at collection points, their role in informing donors, and their support in logistical organisation transformed every contribution into real support. **Their commitment is our true driving force.**

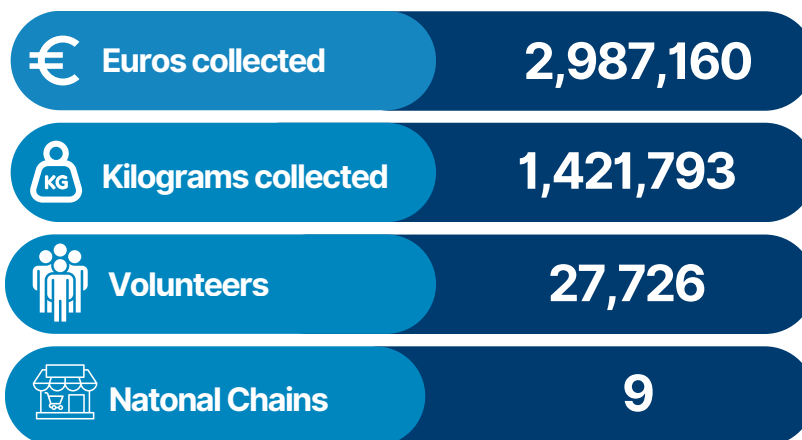
The campaigns were carried out in a mixed format, combining in-store food collections with financial donations at checkout. This approach enabled maximum participation and greater efficiency in aid management. The campaigns were further strengthened by the collaboration of major retail chains, corporate volunteering initiatives, and media support, which played a key role in raising awareness and mobilising society.

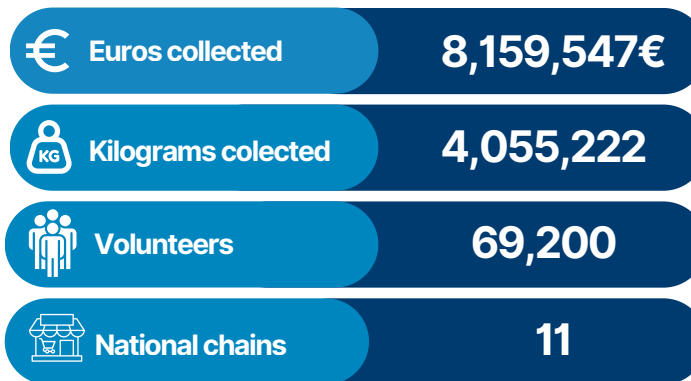


Thanks to public participation, Food Banks were able to stock their warehouses to ensure the distribution of food to people in vulnerable situations in the months that followed.

Solidarity campaigns

In 2025, numerous companies carried out nationwide campaigns in support of Food Banks. Some of them include:



Payroll Giving

A corporate social responsibility and social action initiative in which employees voluntarily donate part of their salary to support the Food Banks.



Yellow Friday

A solidarity initiative that promotes awareness and sharing. Under the slogan 'The real bargain is sharing,' it seeks to encourage responsible consumption, converting every kilo of bananas purchased into an additional kilo donated to the Food Banks.



Ningún Hogar Sin Alimentos

A solidarity initiative focused on awareness-raising and fundraising to ensure that people at risk of food poverty have access to dignified food. The funds raised are transformed into food.

FESBAL ACTIVITIES



Reciclos

Recycling campaign at national and regional level; each recycled container generates “Reciclos points” which are converted into funds to purchase food in Support of Food Banks.



Céntimos Solidarios

A permanent voluntary donation programme that allows Eroski customers to add a small contribution by rounding up their purchase total at checkout, which is then allocated to social causes, including support for Food Banks.



Kellogg's FESBAL Awards

A solidarity initiative promoted by Kellogg's and FESBAL aimed at recognising and fostering innovative projects developed by Food Banks or partner organisations in their fight against food poverty.



Panecillo Solidario

A Christmas initiative by Lidl Spain involving the sale of a pack of rye and cranberry bread rolls. The proceeds are allocated to FESBAL to support Food Banks in the purchase and distribution of basic products for people in vulnerable situations. The initiative is supported by chefs Karlos Arguiñano and Joseba Arguiñano



Arroz solidario

A circular economy and social impact project based on the recycling of coffee capsules. The compost obtained is used to cultivate rice fields located in the Ebro Delta. This rice is then donated to Food Banks for distribution among people and communities in vulnerable situations.



Tu compra ayuda | Compra uno, donamos uno

A solidarity initiative promoted by Unilever in partnership with DIA. Through this action, for every Unilever product purchased in DIA supermarkets, an identical product is donated to social organisations such as FESBAL, for distribution through Food Banks.



Food Banks Chair | UPM

The Food Banks | UPM Chair has been working since 2013 to raise awareness and mobilise society in the fight against food poverty and food waste.

The main activities carried out in 2025 were:

1th Edition Programa Coral

An awareness-raising programme on food waste and responsible consumption aimed at primary and special education schools. It includes talks delivered by Food Banks (18) and a drawing competition to reinforce learning.

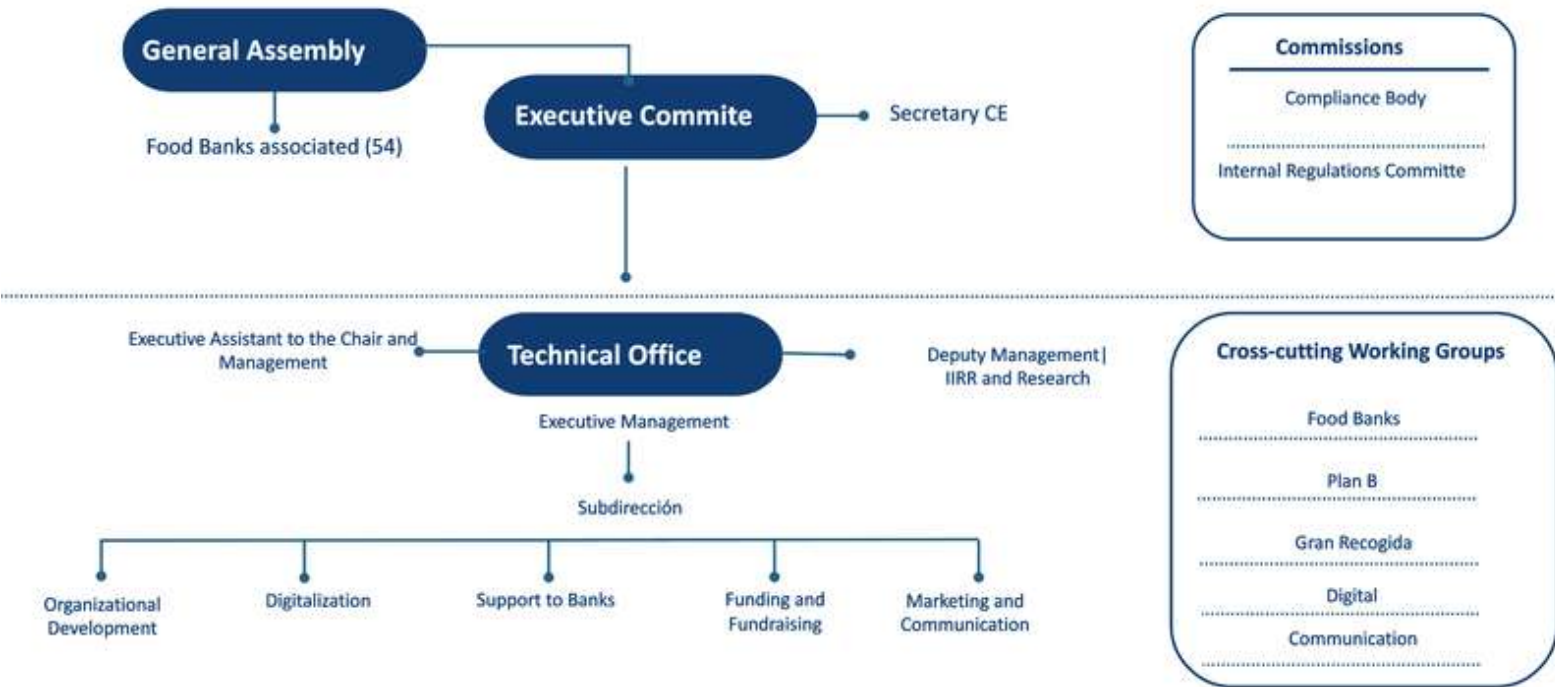

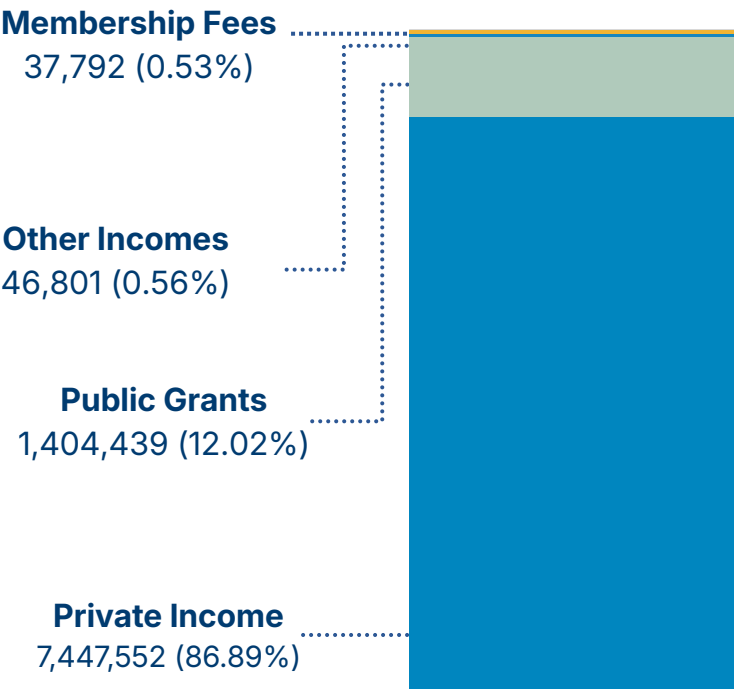

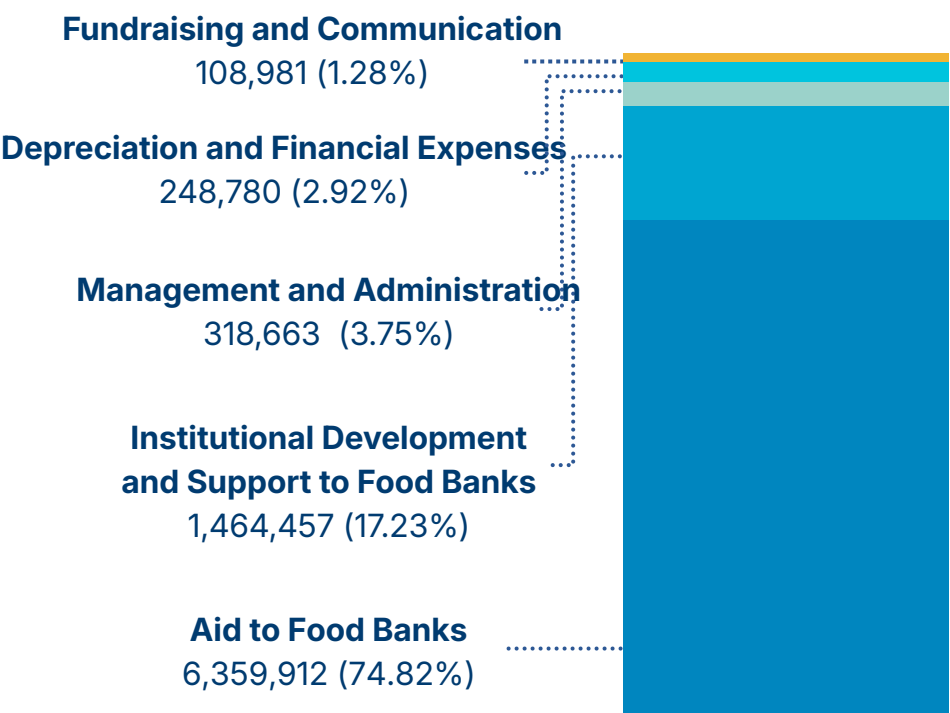
As of December 2025, the team is made up of 30 people — 12 women and 18 men — most of whom are volunteers who manage the Federation's day-to-day operations.
