1. Project Overview

- **Project Title:** Building Community Resource Hubs in Kibera, Nyakach, and Butula
- **Locations:** Kibera (Nairobi), Nyakach (Kisumu), Butula (Busia)
- **Target Group:** Youth and community members (ages 15-35)
- **Duration:** 12 months
- **Total Budget:** \$100,000
- **Implementing Organization:** Saidika Organization

2. Project Goal and Objectives

- **Goal:** Empower youth in Kibera, Nyakach, and Butula by establishing community resource hubs that foster education, skills development, and entrepreneurship.
- **Objectives:**
 - Set up community resource hubs in each location.
 - Provide skills training in areas like tailoring, ICT, and agriculture.
 - Facilitate youth entrepreneurship through business development support.
 - Offer digital literacy and life skills training.
 - Provide mentorship and networking opportunities for 200 youth.

3. Key Activities

- **Youth Mobilization & Selection:**
 - Engage local community leaders and organizations to identify and recruit 200 youth participants (100 from each region).
 - Transparent selection process based on vulnerability criteria (unemployment, school dropout, low-income).
- **Scholarship Allocation:**
 - Provide scholarships for the most vulnerable participants, covering training costs and startup kits.
- **Training Modules:**
 - **Vocational Skills:** Tailoring, ICT, Agribusiness, etc.
 - **Life Skills:** Leadership, communication, and personal development.
 - **Business & Entrepreneurship:** Business planning, budgeting, and marketing.
- **Mentorship & Coaching:**
 - Assign mentors to provide personalized support.
 - Organize group mentorship sessions, guest talks, and youth networking events.
- **Startup Support:**
 - Provide in-kind support or seed grants to help youth start businesses.
 - Offer job placement opportunities or internships in local businesses.
- **Monitoring & Evaluation:**
 - Implement a robust M&E system to track progress, measure impact, and adapt as needed.

- Use surveys and data collection tools to monitor outcomes and ensure project effectiveness.

- **Continued Mentorship:** Extend mentorship beyond the project, with alumni helping new beneficiaries.
- **Local Business Fairs:** Organize community fairs to showcase youth businesses and attract customers.

6. Expected Outcomes

- 200 youth empowered through skills training and entrepreneurship education.
- At least 140 youth (70%) will start small businesses or secure employment.
- Enhanced local economic activity and job creation.
- Reduction in youth unemployment and poverty levels.
- Increased community resilience through self-sustaining youth-led enterprises
