SCALES PANGOLIN RESCUE FUND

Financing the rescue, rehabilitation, release and monitoring of Temminck's Ground Pangolins recovered from the illegal wildlife trade.





WHAT WE DO

Unique in appearance and seldom seen in the wild, yet pangolins have quickly become the most trafficked animal worldwide.

Poached for their scales for use in traditional Asian Medicine which is believed to be a cure for various types of illnesses. Additionally, Pangolin meat is served as a delicacy in some restaurants.

It is imperative that every life is saved to ensure the survival of this amazing and shy species before it is too late.

Rescue

Working closely with law enforcement and the local authorities we assist in sting operations and recovery of trafficked pangolins from the illegal wildlife trade.

Treat

After their rescue, they are taken directly to our veterinary team to be assessed. On admission they are weighed, sedated and put on a fluid drip to assist with dehydration. If the pangolin is female an ultrasound is done to check for pregnancy. X-rays are taken to ensure there are no internal injuries or blockages. They are then tube fed to give them a kick start of strength, depending on how compromised the individual is, they will stay in ICU until they are stronger enough to begin their rehabilitation.

Rehabilitate

This stage can take anything from a couple of weeks, up to a year depending on the condition of the individual when they arrive. During this time, they are housed in a secure location and taken for daily feeding walks allowing them to forage for their favourite ants.

Monitor & Release

They begin their journey back to the wild being closely monitored. Released in a secure wild area fitted with tracking devices that allow their movements to be tracked remotely, and so they can be physically located for health checks.

The pangolins are monitored very closely for the first few days, whilst they familiarize themselves with the area. Once settled, feeding well and finding good shelter to sleep they are then left to continue without supervision. Monitors will locate them daily for the first couple of weeks to do a health check, weighing them to confirm they are still feeding well. Over time this is then reduced to twice weekly, once a week, twice a month and then once a month until the team is confident the pangolin is established and happy in its new home. The tags are removed, and the pangolin can continue their life in the wild!
