Introduction



LK Domain Registry



Since pioneering domain name registration in Sri Lanka over three decades ago, the LK Domain Registry is hailed today as a pivotal entity in the country's progressive and dynamic IT landscape.

The Registry is particularly instrumental in administering the country code top-level domain (ccTLD) ".lk". Established in 1990 as an independent national entity providing professional domain registration services, LK Domain Registry is the sole administrator of the top-level ".lk" domain.

Engaged in developing progressive domain policies and at the forefront of implementing rapidly evolving technologies, the ".lk" domain ensures a credible national identity for a plethora of Sri Lankan organizations aiming to establish their presence across the globe.

In pursuit of this objective, the Registry places considerable emphasis on enhancing and expanding training and educational opportunities. It drives several high-impact social empowerment initiatives through its Partnership Division and e-Learning Division, aiming to fulfil the mandate of enhancing Internet usage and fostering a better digital landscape within Sri Lanka.

Hithawathi, fully funded and operated by the LK Domain Registry is one such initiative.

Hithawathi Initiative

Hithawathi (meaning 'female confidante' in Sinhala) is a social empowerment initiative that is essentially a response to the needs of victims of cyber violence, in particular women and girls.

Its role is to calm the victim; give hope; stop extreme actions such as suicide; and provide necessary technical assistance and guidance to resolve the issue.

Hithawathi also seeks to pre-empt abuse in cyber space by building awareness among the most vulnerable and promotes cybersafety in Sri Lanka, with a particular focus on females and children.

Hithawathi Overview



"Hithawathi" comprises three integral components:

- 1. A free help desk for individuals who do not feel secure on the Internet.
- 2. Creation and dispersion of comprehensive cybersafety awareness content.
- 3. Conducting awareness sessions on cybersafety.







Help Desk support is extended through multiple channels - a call centre, email service, web chat, Facebook Messenger, WhatsApp, and Viber. All of which are supported on all three languages spoken in Sri Lanka –Sinhala, Tamil, and English. While there is no gender restriction on Hithawathi services, the hotline is handled by female officers who are better equipped to handle a distressed female or child callers. The project also emphasises compassionate and empathetic support, recognising the mental state of victims who often feel helpless and desperate. The project name, Hithawathi (female confidante), also signifies a close, friendly and trustworthy relationship.

Cybersafety content to create awareness includes physical materials such as leaflets and booklets, as well as appealing, high-quality digital resources like posters, clips, reels, and videos. These digital resources are often created by skilled content creators, aiming to raise awareness about cybersafety and to promote Hithawathi services. All digital content is easily accessible on the Hithawathi website and across various social media platforms.

Cybersafety awareness sessions involve physical gatherings primarily held at venues carefully chosen based on their ability to reach the target audience.



Project Updates



January

February

- As per the request of Meta, submitted a plan for a cyber safety campaign to conduct in line with International Women's day. Produced five shorts to promote cyber-safety.
- 2nd edition of Cybersecurity booklet was submitted for National Library recommendation.
- Hithawathi did a presentation to showcase the educational materials at the segment "A snapshot of the Educational Landscape", of the 'Social Dialogue on Technology Facilitated Sexual & Gender Based Violence (TFSGBV)' organized by CENWOR at the University of Colombo.
- Trained a new person for Hithawathi team.

March
