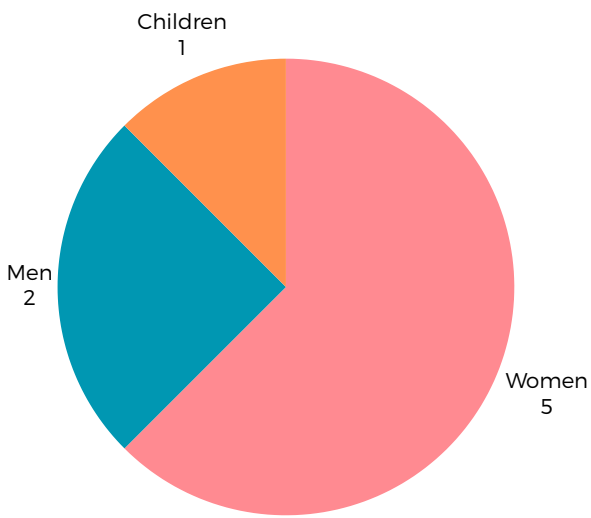
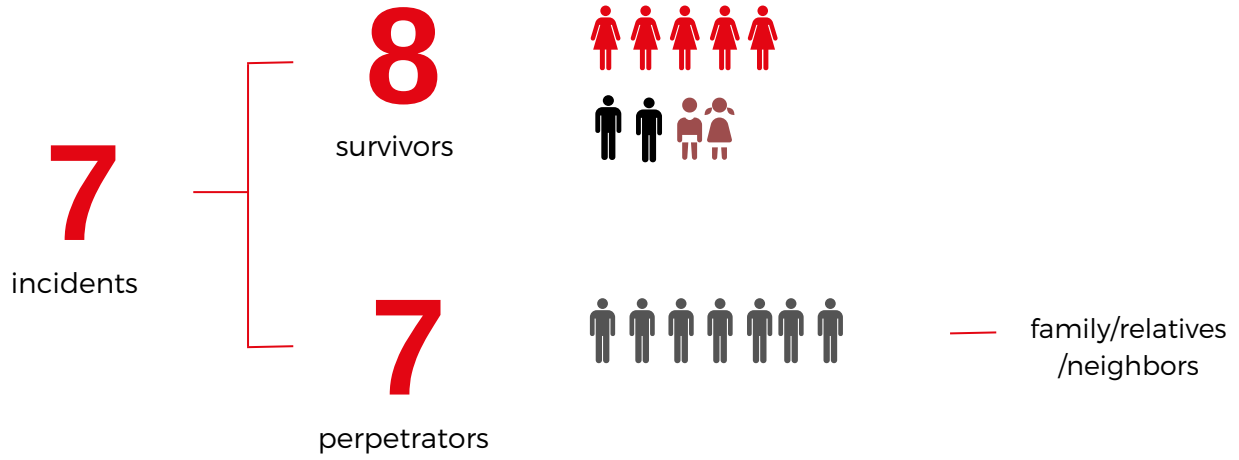


Fig.1: Sex Ratio

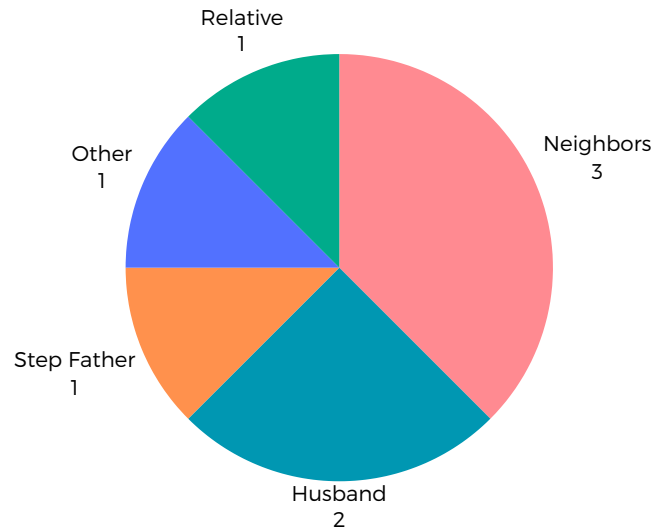


Fig.2: Perpetrators

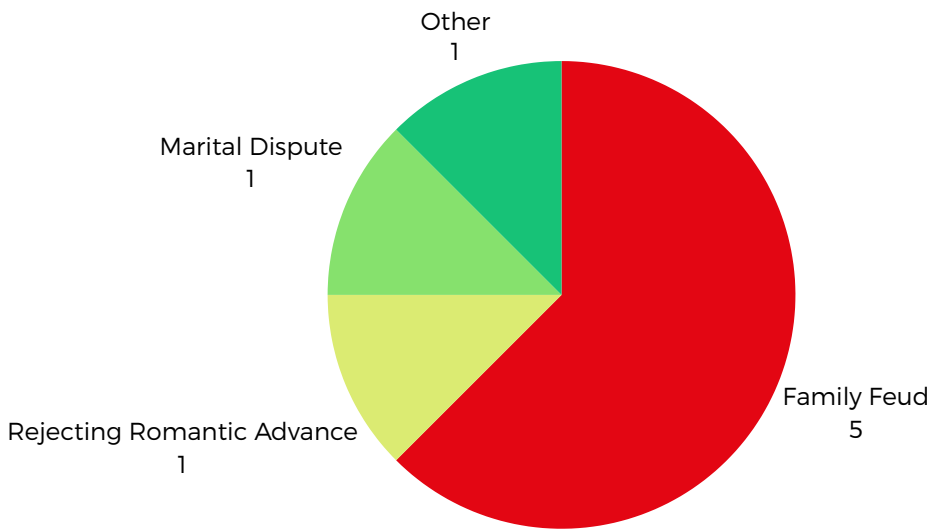


Fig.3: Causes

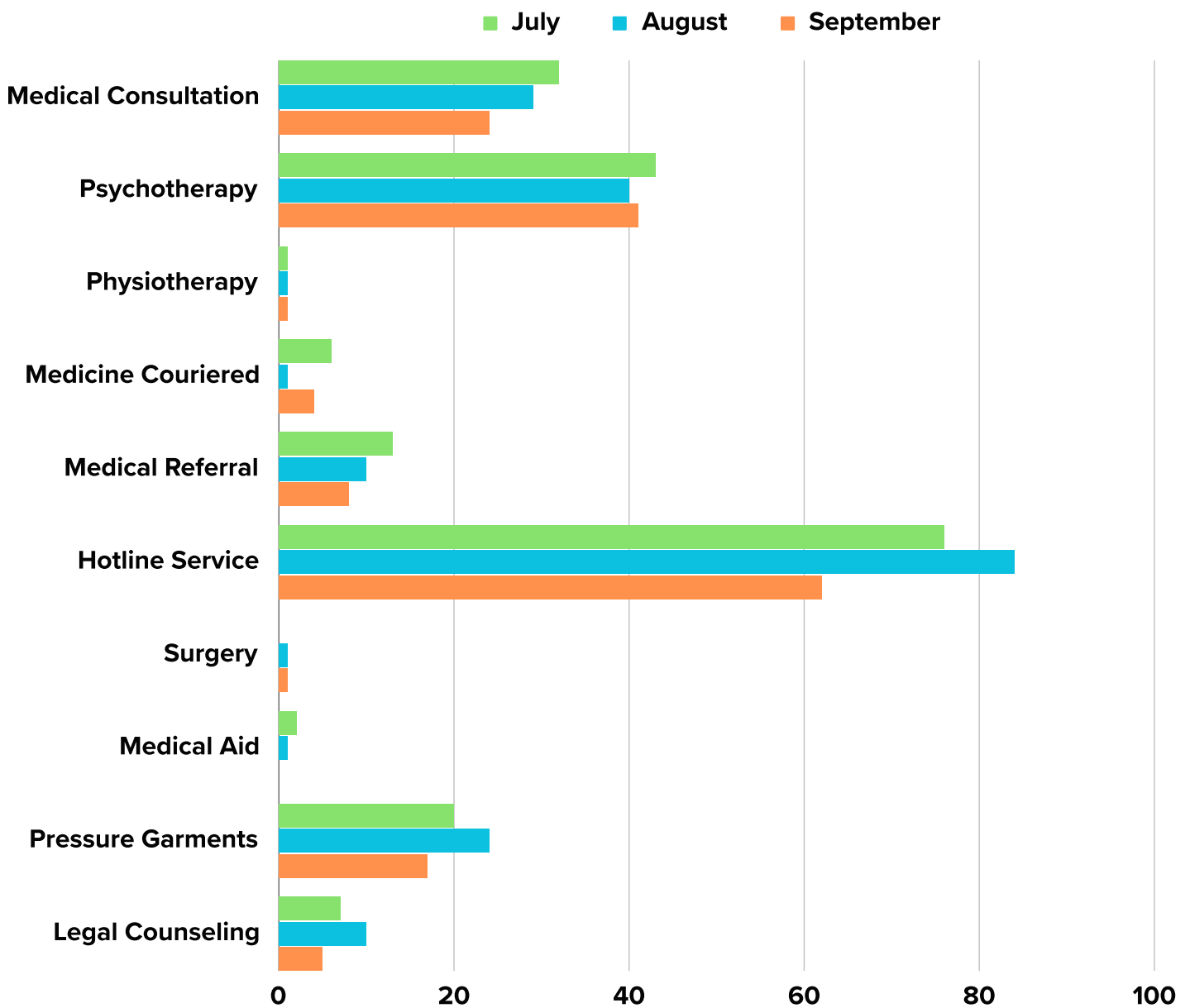

In her desperate quest for healing, Surma was first rushed to Barisal Sadar Hospital and later found solace and treatment at the Acid Survivors Foundation (ASF). Undergoing numerous surgeries, she displayed incredible resilience in the face of excruciating pain.

Tragically, Surma's ordeal didn't end with her physical wounds. Her own parents, perhaps driven by fear or societal pressures, urged her to move on after filing a case against her assailant. This painful decision severed the ties that should have been her support system, leaving Surma without a home or family to turn to.

It was in this bleak moment that ASF extended its compassionate hand. Surma found refuge within its walls, where she resided for three years. ASF didn't stop at providing her shelter; they also helped her secure employment at the Bhola Children's School in 2005.

Yet, the shadows of Surma's past continue to haunt her. She carries the heavy burden of being the sole breadwinner for her family, as her husband refuses to work. Her daily existence is marked by constant pain in her eyes and head, leaving her in a state of perpetual discomfort.

ASF, recognizing the enduring trauma that Surma carries, has been her pillar of support. They provide her with not only medical but also psychological assistance. Her journey to recovery is arduous, but her spirit remains unbroken.
