Why Support Afghan Women?

Afghanistan is going through an <u>employment crisis</u>. Hundreds of thousands of jobs have been lost since the Taliban takeover last August, with women particularly hard hit, the <u>U.N.'s International Labor Organization estimates</u>. In the last 20 years, Afghan women have had an active role in the global technology sector. This Program aims to provide the opportunity for more women from Afghanistan at this critical time to secure the gains and further build up to create future leaders in the technology sector who are Afghan Women.

About the Program

This program primarily focuses on providing remote employment and leadership development opportunities for **50 talented Afghan women** globally and in Afghanistan. The 50 women in tech program will enable these women to utilize their technical skills and abilities to work remotely with different private, NGOs and technology companies.

The program is a full-year remote IT fellowship for Afghans. Each woman will receive a stipend and IT equipment. To fund this initiative, we have launched a grand challenge allowing donors from all around the world to participate in supporting these women.

The program's first two months are an extensive learning opportunity. in the later nine months, the fellow will be working with one of the partners of this grand challenge as a full-time team member. In the final month, team members present their work to the IT firm they've been a fellow with and work with them with the goal of being offered a permanent and paid position.

Successful applicants will be given a full-time paid remote employee for this program. All necessary equipment in order to support these women to work with partner organizations, including Aseel, Code to Inspire, Canadian women for women in Afghanistan, ACAA, Ehtesab, and RapidIteration will be provided to them.

Who Can Apply?

All women from Afghanistan can apply from anywhere in the world; preference is given to those who can full fill the requirement of the program as mentioned.

The program partners

code <to> (inspire) **Code to Inspire (CTI)** uses technology education and outreach to provide Afghan women with leverage in their fight for social, political, and economic equality. We build skills and infrastructure for women to compete in the global tech market, empowering them financially and socially. As role models for other young Afghan women, CTI graduates demonstrate that women are capable of adding value to their communities far beyond simple housework.



Canadian women for women in Afghanistan (CW4WAfghan) is a charity and not-for-profit organization. Since our founding in 1998, CW4WAfghan has trained more than 10,000 teachers, provided literacy classes for nearly 5,000 students, distributed nearly 300 school library starter kits, established 40 community libraries and 262 science labs, and shared thousands of resources through our Darakht-e Danesh Digital Library. Our main program areas include: (1) Investments in Basic Education; (2) Community Libraries, Literacy and Books; (3) Technology for Education; (4) Public Engagement and (5) Afghanistan Policy Dialogue.

Afghanistan and Central Asian Association is a registered charity that supports London's refugee community and the Afghan diaspora in the United Kingdom. The organisation also campaigns for human rights, democracy and the fair treatment of refugees in Afghanistan and around the world. We work with Afghans and Central Asians living away from their homeland, providing them with support, skills and knowledge to live and prosper in the UK. Our wide range of services includes English language classes, employment workshops, a women's support group, a Saturday school and homework club, youth and family support services, drop-in and telephone advice, volunteer placements, and cultural and social events. We provide outreach and visits to individuals and families in detention. We also work in Afghanistan, where we are developing citizens advice centres in Kabul and Pul-e-Khumri, following a successful pilot project from 2013–2016.



Ehtesab is an Afghan-based startup focused on developing viable civic technology solutions to serve the needs of communities and those who reside within them At Ehtesab, we believe civic technology can connect citizens to their governments and influence the work of those who lead them.

Our aim is to provide a streamlined platform for citizens to share critical issues – ensuring they aren't ignored. We believe that the best way to address the challenges of state and local governments is to work in unison with communities and involve them in the process of shaping the places they call home. The Aseel 50 women in tech is a program designed to recruit, develop, and empower Afghan female talent worldwide, specifically in Afghanistan. Chosen candidates will work remotely alongside global staff using Aseel's advanced cloud environment showcasing professional skills and abilities. Join our mission to support Afghan families by raising emergency relief funds through Aseel's impact-driven platform and partnering with artisans to provide entrepreneurial opportunities.

Description

The selection committee will determine each candidate's eligibility through a series of steps, beginning with registration questions. The registration link can be found on the website. Top candidates will be evaluated based on organizational, communication, and critical thinking skills. Additionally, candidates may be required to submit a writing sample. Chosen candidates will be offered a career opportunity that best matches their skillset.
