Executive Summary

The Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan Plantation Drive, conducted on September 30, 2024, in collaboration with various partners, marks a major environmental initiative aimed at enhancing urban greenery in Lahore. With the support of the Parks and Horticulture Authority, Chaon Foundation, and 200 volunteers from the University of Central Punjab, this project led to the plantation of over 10,000 trees at Ali Road, Township, Lahore. This drive, aligned with the UN Sustainable Development Goals, particularly Goals 11, 13, and 15, supports climate action, biodiversity conservation, and sustainable urban living.

This initiative is part of the larger Alkhidmat Sarsabz Pakistan campaign, which addresses pressing environmental issues such as pollution, urban heat, and deforestation in Pakistan. Given the country's challenges with deforestation, air pollution, and climate change, the plantation drive aims to sequester carbon, release oxygen, and mitigate the impacts of climate change, especially in densely populated areas. The project, with a budget of USD 1,020 funded by Global Giving, showcases the effectiveness of community involvement in sustainable development and promotes environmental awareness.

The success of this plantation drive emphasizes Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan's commitment to environmental sustainability and sets a strong foundation for future green initiatives in Pakistan.

Background

The Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan Plantation Drive, held on September 30, 2024, at Ali Road, Township, Lahore, was a collaborative effort involving AKFP, the Parks and Horticulture Authority (PHA), Chaon Foundation, and the University of Central Punjab (UCP). This large-scale plantation initiative is part of a broader environmental campaign led by AKFP to restore green spaces, reduce pollution, and mitigate climate change impacts within urban areas of Pakistan.

Why Plantation in Pakistan?

Pakistan faces significant environmental challenges, including deforestation, air pollution, water scarcity, and a high vulnerability to climate change. Rapid urbanization and industrialization have contributed to the depletion of natural resources and a decline in air quality, particularly in major cities. Planting trees can mitigate these issues by absorbing carbon dioxide, releasing oxygen, reducing heat, and filtering pollutants, ultimately improving the quality of urban life.
