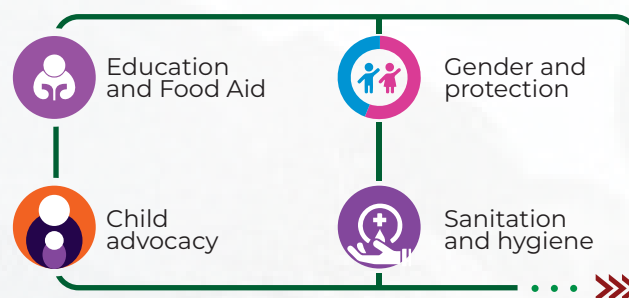


Background

Clare Cares Foundation operates across Lagos, Ogun, Delta, Enugu and Abuja, responding to the needs of vulnerable populations by promoting education and protecting the rights of the girl child, rights of children generally through organized educational seminars to sensitize the youths against vices such as rape and child abuse while actively responding to building capacity, attending to the needs of the people through programs in a range of sectors like education, child care, gender, livelihood support and hygiene.
