

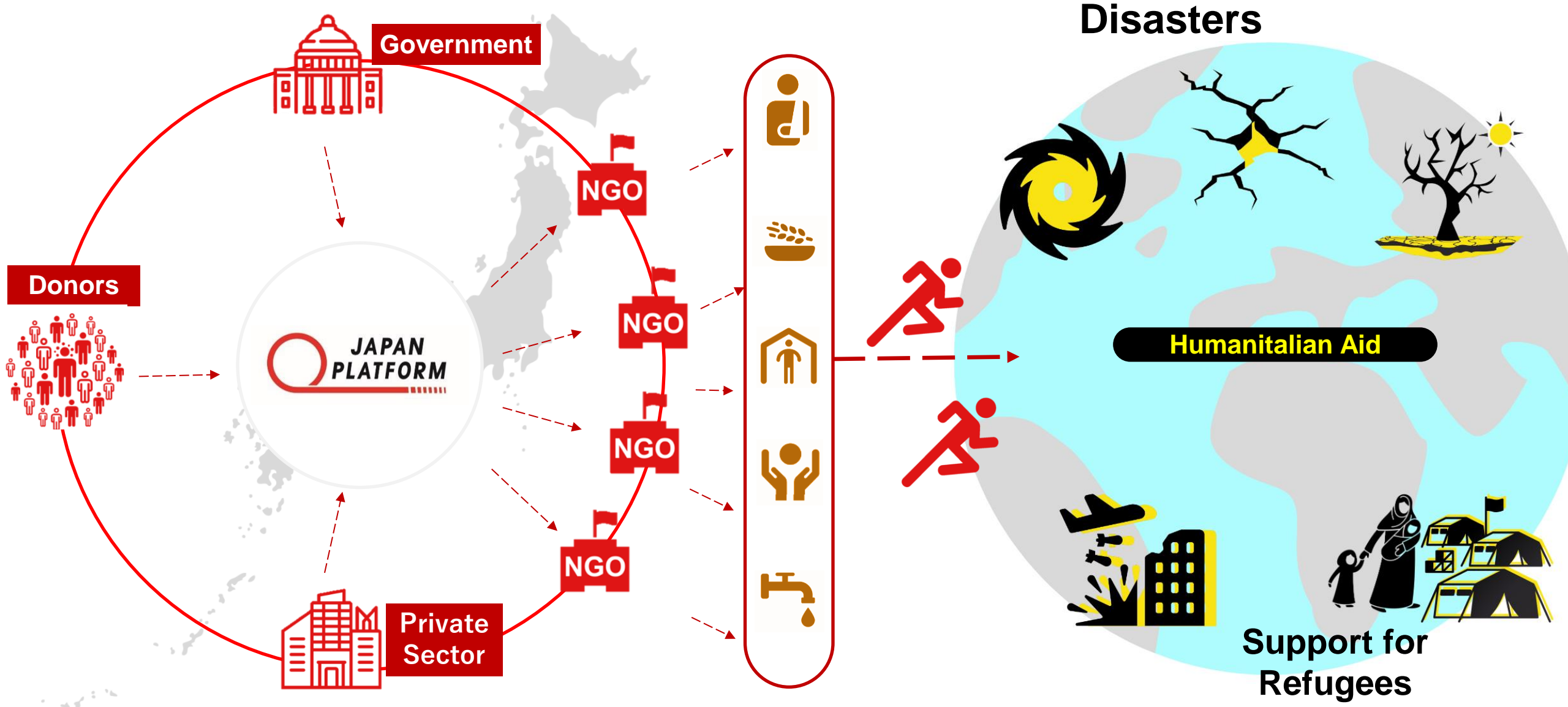

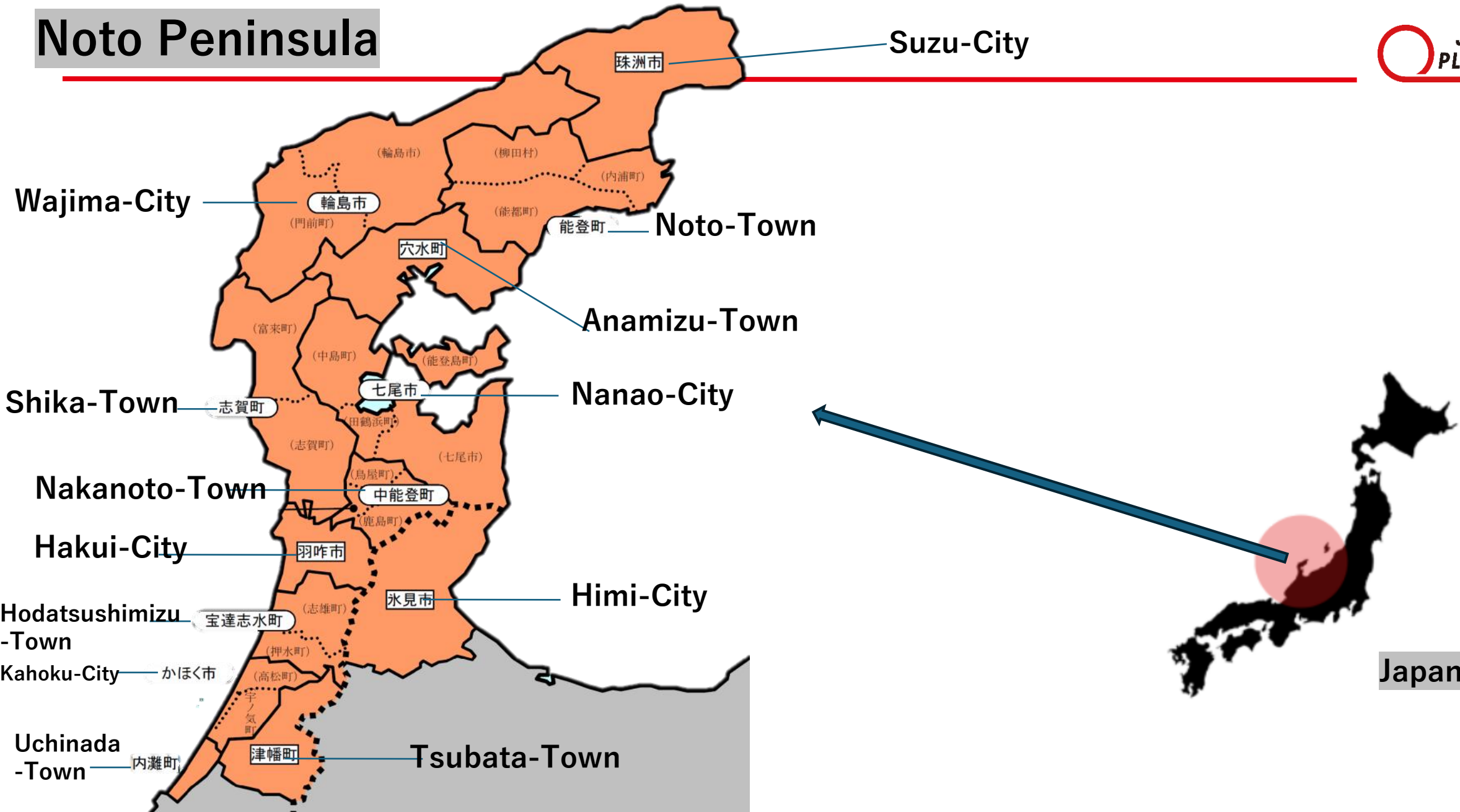

Support activities by JPF member NGOs

- After the Noto Peninsula earthquake in 2024, Peace Winds Japan (PW), a member NGO, rushed to Suzu City first and provided medical support in cooperation with the Health and Medical Welfare Coordination Headquarters. The Peace Boat Disaster Relief (PBV) responded to requests from the cities of Wajima and Suzu and carried out coordination work to connect evacuees in shelters and at home with private support. JPF financially supports these efforts and has established a system to learn and share information with each other even during normal times.

And on **Sep.21.2024** (after about 9months from the earthquake)
NOTO peninsula has got additional damages due to very heavy rain.

- Japan Platform has decided to expand support plan for the "2024 Noto Peninsula Earthquake Relief" that has been ongoing since January 1 this year. We will deliver support to save lives by making the most of the networks we have established in the region and the diverse strengths of our member NGOs.

Period: January 2, 2024 - March 31, 2025

- Target Areas: Areas affected by torrential rain disaster and Noto Peninsula Earthquake in 2024
- Contents: Emergency Humanitarian Aid, survey, material support such as food and daily necessities, support for evacuees (shelters, homes), support for the disabled, elderly, and children
- JPF member NGOs 10 JPF member NGOs are active in the area.

The period and budget for support will be reviewed as necessary according to the local situation.

Overview

•The Okunoto region of Ishikawa Prefecture, which was severely damaged by the Noto Peninsula Earthquake of 2024 that occurred on January 1 this year, has been hit by torrential rain since September 21, and as of 15:00 on September 23, Ishikawa Prefecture announced that 7 people were killed, 2 were missing, and 12 were injured in Suzu City, Wajima City, and Noto Town.

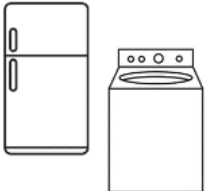
