
Our Mission

Our Work Across Bangladesh

Cox's Bazar Hospital for Women and Children

Cox's Bazar Hospital for Women and Children, provides low-cost medical care, including medication, evaluation and treatment, preventative health education and minor surgeries. No one is turned away, regardless of ability to pay.

The Hospital is committed to providing education in maternity health, prenatal and infant care, breast-feeding, preventative health and family planning, and to increasing child abuse awareness, providing acute medical care, treatment, and rehabilitative services.

Hope Medical Centers

Hope Medical Centers provide reduced-cost healthcare and free services to Bangladeshis in rural and underserved regions.



Hope Foundation assists sponsors in setup, maintenance, and expansion of each Center. Additionally, with the help of philanthropic organizations and other partners, Hope provides funds, medical supplies, and equipment. The long-term goal of Hope Foundation is to make each Center self-sustaining.

Ambulance Service

Many people in rural areas live far from medical assistance. During a medical or surgical emergency or a complicated childbirth, many die at home or on the way to a hospital for want of proper transportation.



Hope Foundation is working to develop an emergency medicine and transportation network for Bangladesh, beginning by linking satellite clinics to Cox's Bazar Hospital for Women and Children. The network will eventually consist of a fleet of ambulances with trained medical personnel who will provide emergency treatment on the scene and safe transportation to the nearest hospital.

Rural Camp Services

Rural Health Camps are held in remote areas where there are no doctors. This program began in 2005. In 2006, it expanded with funding from the Australian High Commission of Bangladesh. So far, over 35 Rural Health Camps have successfully

provided medical care to over 15,000 of people. These camps are attended by specialist doctors from urban areas, who provide basic medical care, specialist consultation, minor surgery and follow-up instructions.

Project EyeHope

Hope Foundation has partnered with Cox's Bazar Community Eye Hospital, which provides low-cost eye treatment and operations, targeting the very poor of the community. Under the partnership agreement, the Eye Hospital doctors will run periodic health camps at Hope Medical Centers and at Cox's Bazar Hospital for Women and Children. During the health camp, surgically correctable cataract cases will be selected from the poor and needy patients attending the camp.
