Sebastian was born in Ecuador in 2008 with cleft lip and palate. He underwent his first surgery with the GSF team that year. Ever since then, he and his family have been part of our GSF family. Sebastian continues to receive cleft care services from our team. Over the past 15 years, he has received dental care, speech therapy, psychosocial support, and has undergone other surgical procedures including cleft palate repair and alveolar bone grafting.

Since many GSF volunteers return to the same locations annually, Sebastian's care team has been consistent, allowing for best outcomes and close relationships. In 2020, he became our youngest volunteer with GSF Ecuador and is now part of our incredible group of patients who provide crucial support during our programs in the country.

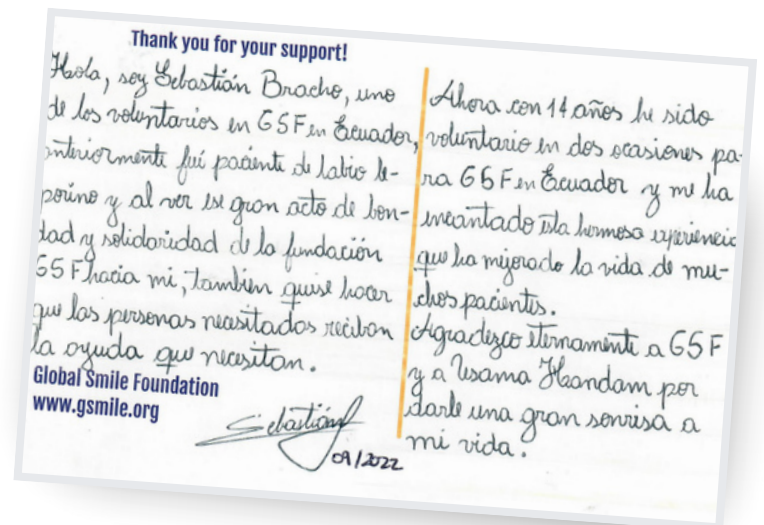

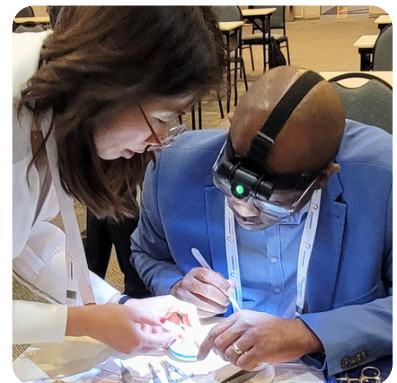

TRAINING CLEFT PROVIDERS TO BUILD GLOBAL CAPACITY



5TH INTERNATIONAL EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOP

GSF celebrated **five years** of leading our ground-breaking educational conference for cleft providers at this year's event in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil in October 2022. Since its inception in 2018, the Comprehensive Cleft Care Workshop (CCCW) has become an internationally acclaimed event and now includes a faculty roster of 70+ world leaders from integrated cleft care specialties.

This year also saw the launch of the **World Cleft Summit** at our event in Rio, bringing together CCCW speakers to address critical issues of team-based care with the purpose of sharing insights to improve the standard of care globally.

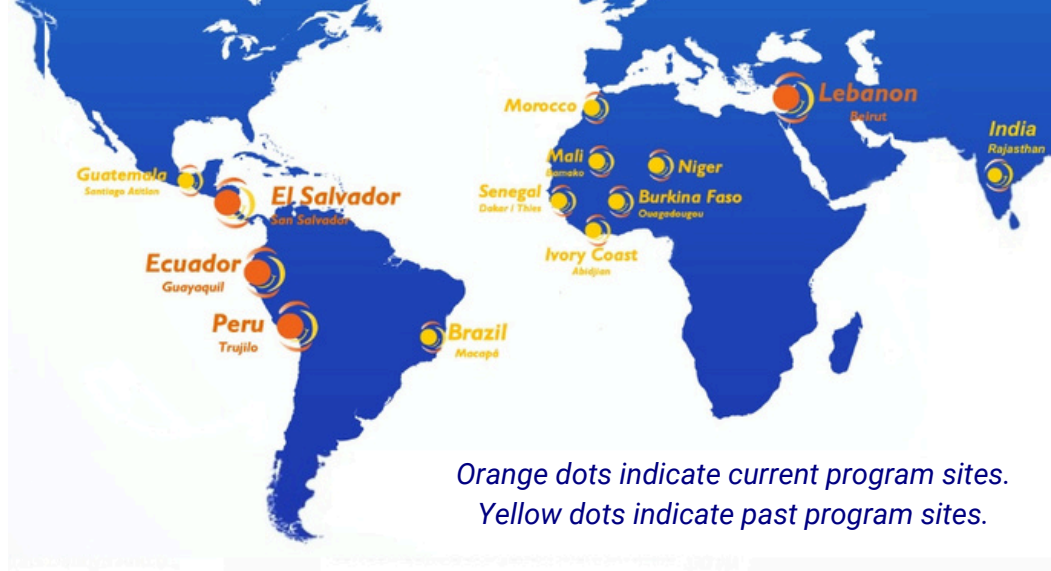

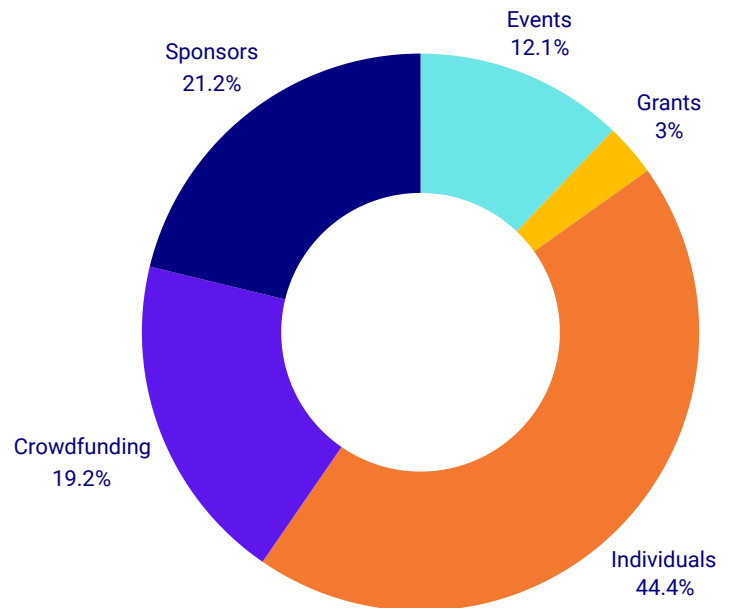
Donations make outreach programs possible, putting our volunteer teams on the ground to provide comprehensive cleft care services.

The support received in 2022 included in-kind donations of products and equipment, which totaled \$360,271.

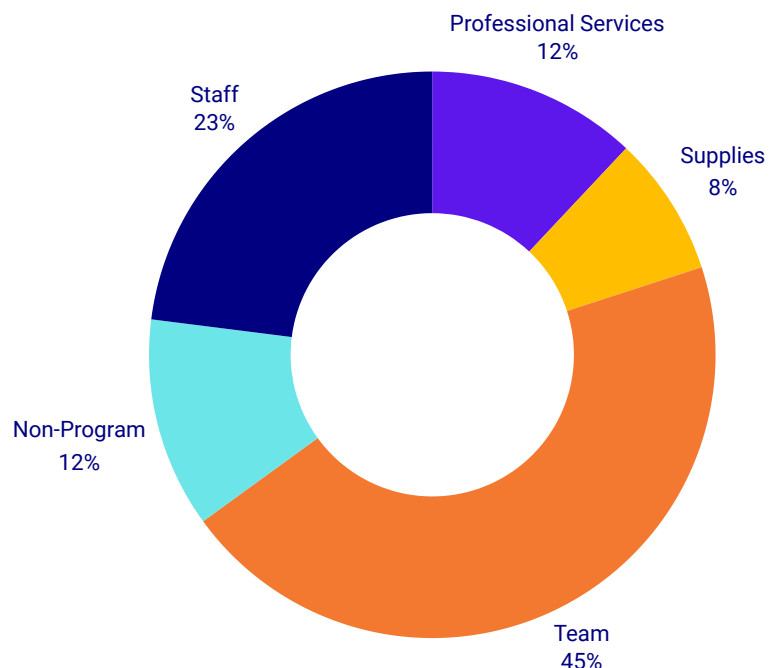
Crowdfunding campaigns are fundraisers run by our volunteers or by third parties on our behalf.



EXPENSES

Expenses in 2022 included the following categories:

- **Team:** Supporting volunteers on the ground during programs, including licensing, air and ground transportation, and accommodations. The cost of travel was defrayed by airline miles donated and earned.
- **Non-Program:** Office, administration, and staff not associated directly with outreach programs.
- **Staff:** Program staff that handle organization, in-country partnerships, and patient outreach.
- **Professional Services:** The outsourcing of marketing, business services, and other services not managed in house due to lower staffing levels in 2022.
- **Supplies:** GSF brings all of the medical supplies and medicine needed on our outreach programs. The cost of these materials was defrayed by in-kind donations of products and equipment.
