WHAT WE DO IN BRAZIL



In Brazil we support the **Fraternity Without Borders Orchestra** project, which provides music education to young people from the slums. We help the homeless through 6 “Fraternity on the Streets” centres in 4 Brazilian states and 4 US cities. In Mato Grosso do Sul, the project is carried out through a partnership with “Clinic of the Soul - MS”.

In Roraima, we support **migrant and refugee families from Venezuela**, who have crossed the border into Brazil in search of a new life.

In Campina Grande and Minas Gerais, we contribute to the treatment of **children with microcephaly**, in partnership with the Professor João Amorim Neto Research Institute. The **Portraits of Hope** project, in the Sertão of Bahia, and the children with *Epidermolysis bullosa*, supported by **Garden of Butterflies**.

WHAT WE DO IN AFRICA



In Sub-Saharan Africa, we are presente in **Madagascar, Mozambique, Malawi**, and the **Democratic Republic of Congo**. On the west coast, we work in **Senegal**, and in Central America, in **Haiti**.

We build and operate shelters that provide essential services such as food, hygiene and health care, educational and cultural activities, and vocational training. We also extend our support to the elderly through food aid and housing construction. In African villages, we drill artesian wells to provide access to water, paving the way for sustainable agricultural practices. Our initiatives include training young farmers and engaging children in environmental education.

YOUTH PROGRAM



YOUTH PROGRAM



The Youth Programme takes place in Mozambique and is part of the Dream Without Borders Program.

It aims to contribute to **the reduction of school drop-outs, early pregnancies, drug use, idleness, and financial difficulties**, since many young people stop studying to help with expenses at home.

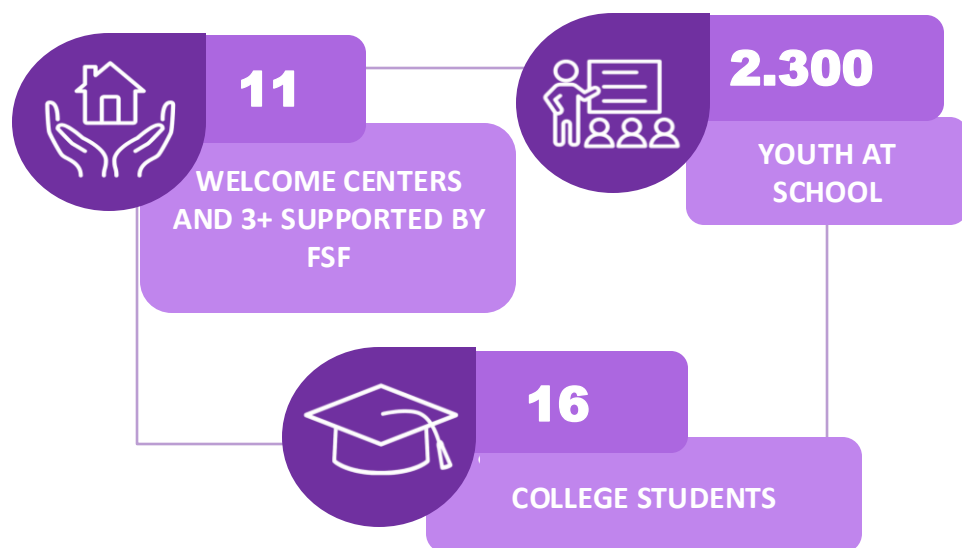
We have a coordination that focuses on the main challenges of the young people: their needs, aspirations, and general accompaniment. The programme is able to support the young people in the shelter and increase the impact on their lives. To develop a relationship of trust and friendship and co-creating with parents and community the environment in which all can experience the values of Fraternity Without Borders and achieve all the desired opportunities.

It is our intention that the Youth Program will Grow in strength and extend to other FWB projects.

YOUTH PROGRAM

When the children complete grade 7, they become part of the Youth Program, enter **High School (grade 8 through grade 12)** and receive:

- ✓ Daily food
- ✓ Financial resource of 500MT/month from January to December for:
 - Transportation (chapa);
 - School material;
 - Uniforms.

YOUNG PRE-COLLEGE STUDENT



When young people **finish the 12th grade** and cannot get into a university or technical course, their chances of finding a job are very limited. Either because of the lack of preparatory schools, such as “cursinhos” (private preparatory courses for university entrance in Brazil), or because of the need to help with household expenses, many take any job opportunity.

In this context, we have created a study room and started a small library that aims **to support all young people in this university preparation or in this new stage of their student and professional life**. They organize themselves to use the study room and the computer for research and study groups. We accompany them and seek online or face-to-face support from teachers and professionals who add knowledge and facilitate learning.

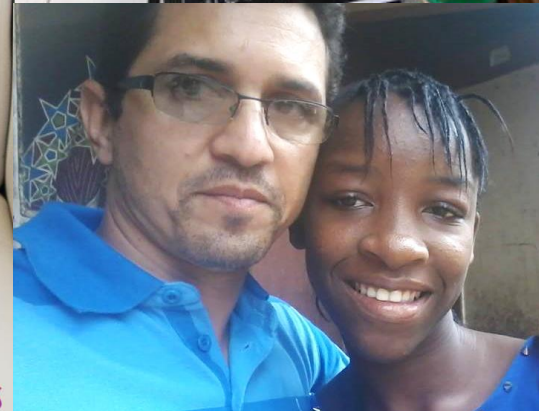
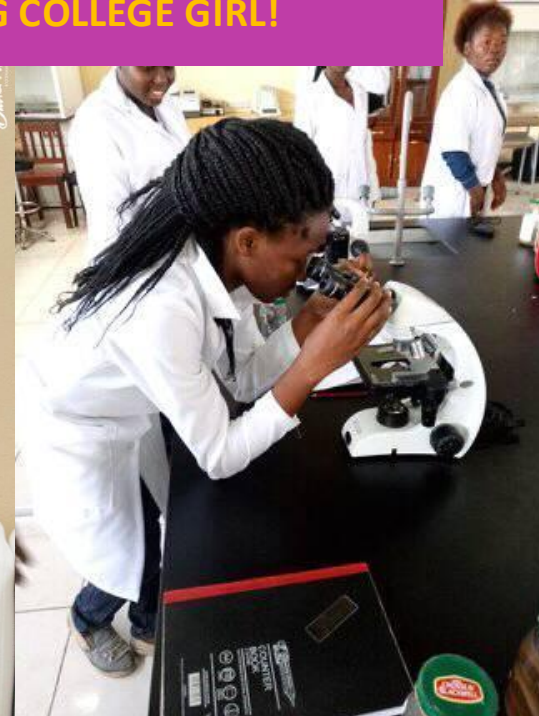

In August 2022, we will gradually resume our educational activities in the centres of Muzumuia, then Matuba and Barragem. These are our pilot centres of this project to receive children from 3 to 5 years old, 1st and 2nd grade with playful, educational and cultural activities.

At the same time, the 7th and 8th grade children will receive support in their school subjects, reinforcement and school support.

And the most important thing about this programme is that the young people in the project are volunteers in this transfer of knowledge and opportunity to the children.

DREAM WITHOUT BORDERS

Its aim is to contribute to **increasing opportunities and future prospects** through access to **knowledge**, mainly at a distance: telecourses, video classes, lectures, etc. Through the internet, it connects people and creates ways to dream beyond any frontier.

The new knowledge opens up new opportunities for the beneficiaries including income generation. Sonhar was born in 2017 in Mozambique and has expanded to other FWB projects and supported projects.

The Project is located in the center of Muzumuia, and serves young people from **Muzumuia, Barragem and Matuba**.

BAKERY

BAKERY

Opened in 2016 in the centre of Muzumuia, the bakery aims to empower young people to be aware and productive citizens.

It is currently in the process of becoming self-sustaining.

The food produced is sold to maintain and invest in the project itself and the youth.

BAKERY TEAM:

- ✓ The workforce is made up of the members of the "**Youth Program**".
- ✓ The team has a coordinator, a fixed FWB employee, and a volunteer monitor who are responsible for training the youth.

WORKING DAY:

- ✓ Each youth works once a week, from Monday to Saturday, in a group of approximately 10 people.
- ✓ The work is done from 5:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m:
 - ✓ Each young person works eight hours per week;
 - ✓ The coordinator works eight hours a day;
 - ✓ The monitor works four hours a day.





BAKERY

WORKSHOP

Training in the bakery lasts for six months, and then the entire team of young people is renewed to open up opportunities for new apprentices.

There are several forms of training, such as:

- ✓ Learning the production process - ingredients quantification, dough preparation, manual bread formation, fermentation process, oven, among other procedures;

BENEFITS FOR THOSE INVOLVED IN THE PROJECT

Besides the benefits resulting from the training, those involved in the project also receive:

- ✓ On the work day each of these young people takes home ten loaves of bread. This way they help support the family, where often these loaves are the only meal of the day.
- ✓ Breakfast and lunch for the kids at the center.
- ✓ All volunteers at the Muzumuia center receive a loaf of bread every day for breakfast.
- ✓ Allowance for the volunteer monitor.

THE RESTRUCTURING PLAN

The bakery was renovated in 2020 and is being restructured to serve not only the center of Muzumuia, but also neighboring villages.

The tendency is for the project to expand more each day and become self-sustaining.

Besides training the young people and keeping it running, the profits from the bakery will be invested in the "Youth Program" in order to fully cover its costs.





ART WITHOUT BORDERS

ART WITHOUT BORDERS

The project seeks to develop and improve skills, to diffuse techniques, and to bring artistic knowledge to the young people sheltered in Muzumuia, Barragem, and Matuba.

- ✓ Batik Art;
- ✓ Xylography Art;
- ✓ Canvas Painting Art;
- ✓ Wall Painting Art;
- ✓ Tie dye art to make T-shirts and bags and silkscreening with the Fraternity without Borders logo;
- ✓ Pyrography Art - drawings on wood;

ART WITHOUT BORDERS

BATIK

- ✓ Project implemented through Art without Borders since 2017, in Muzumuia, today is our "flagship" product in the arts workshop.
- ✓ Batik is made by the kids from the "**Youth Program**", being another form of empowerment for the foster youth.
- ✓ It is a dyeing technique in handmade fabric known as Batique or Batik. The pieces are very colorful and the themes are based on animals and on the daily life in African villages, such as the drawings of women with their bowls and buckets, or the bundles they carry on their heads. In the same way they develop canvases with the same theme, but with other materials and techniques, fixed in wooden frames.
- ✓ The young people learn, produce, and the Batik and canvases are sold by caravanners in FWB events in several countries.
- ✓ The young people earn a small commission on the Batik sold to encourage them in the production of art.

SEWING

With a focus on sustainability, the sewing workshop is a social business within the project that aims to provide opportunities for personal and economic development to young people and monitors.

- ✓ Improves skills, disseminates techniques, develops products, garments, and autonomy of the youngsters.
- ✓ In Mozambique there is the responsibility for the production of Ubuntu Nation products, a Fraternity Without Borders brand.
- ✓ Monitors and the young people in the project develop customized products using colorful capulanas (a typical African cloth), imprinting their personality, spreading and enhancing their talents. On-site and virtual volunteers contribute with new techniques, courses, products, and skills in the workshop.
- ✓ The products manufactured are bought and sold by caravanners in FWB's charitable events in several countries, and are increasingly gaining market in Mozambique.

In the village of Muzumuia we have a small carpentry shop where young people learn to work with wood.

The job provides renovations and creation of pieces for the Reception Center itself and for sale as handicrafts. Currently, there are **7 young people and a teacher** participating in the workshop.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

In Mozambique there are beautiful cultural events that involve **traditional dance (Xigubo and Marrabenta), singing and percussion.**

The FSF highly values all traditions and today we offer young people and children in our centers the opportunity to reconnect with their traditions, develop their talents, as well as self-esteem, self-confidence and pride in their roots. Today, there are 80 young people and 40 children participating in the dance workshop.

RUGBY

Rugby is a sport that combines health and values, with several benefits, both physical and psychological.

As it is a democratic sport, anyone can play rugby, regardless of weight, age and height, as there are positions for everyone during the game.

In addition to working on physical skills such as strength, flexibility, resistance, agility and balance, Rugby is a team sport where for a play to be completed, more than one athlete needs to participate in it.

It is very rare for a single player to be able to cross the entire field without passing the ball to another. In this way, the modality helps in the formation of values, strengthening character, spirit of companionship and teamwork. There are 49 young people who participate in this activity.



SPORTIVE ACTIVITIES

RUGBY

Rugby in Muzumuia began in September 2021, since then young people have been dedicating themselves and in 2002 they began to participate in game activities and exchanges with other clubs at sporting events.

With this movement, young people from the Matuba Village Center became interested in the game and today there are more members in our Sem Fronteiras team.

Even though Rugby activity is recent, a great development of the players is noticeable, both technically and in their conduct of respect and fraternity on the field, with sportsmanship and joy.

- ✓ In 2022 we begin even greater steps towards the project's food sustainability. With the support of partner sponsors and the availability of land in the community, we started planting in two spaces: 15 hectares in Barragem and 23 in Muzumuia with a focus on planting corn and beans that are the basis for meals.
- ✓ With the support of a tractor and an irrigation system, we estimate that we will be able to supply a large part of our annual food demand for the Reception Centers.
