



Sustainable Goat Farming Initiative – Chitwan, Nepal

Executive Summary

This proposal outlines a strategic partnership initiative led by Thirst No More LLC, Thirst No More Corporation, and Himalayan Tribal Community Development Nepal. The project is designed to empower 1,800 families through sustainable goat farming, fostering long-term economic stability, food security, and community resilience.

Project Objective

To equip 1,800 households with the resources, training, and infrastructure needed to establish sustainable goat farming enterprises. Each household will receive three goats, a constructed goat pen, veterinary support, and ongoing training.

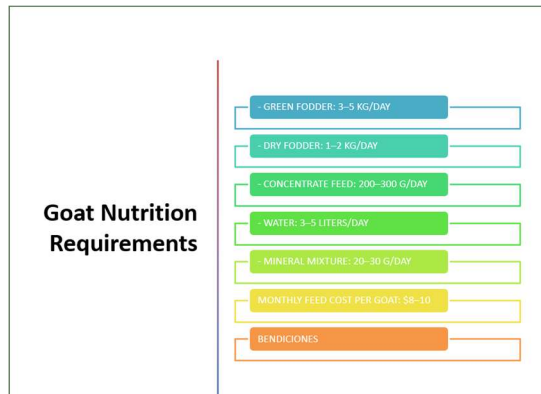


Core Project Components

- Goat Distribution (5,400 goats total)
- Construction of individual household goat pens
- Veterinary services and health monitoring
- Training and capacity building programs
- Monitoring and evaluation systems
- Annual international review and oversight visits

The initiative will generate sustainable income streams, improve household nutrition, and strengthen local economies. Families will gain access to both meat and dairy resources, while also developing entrepreneurial skills through cooperative engagement and market participation.
