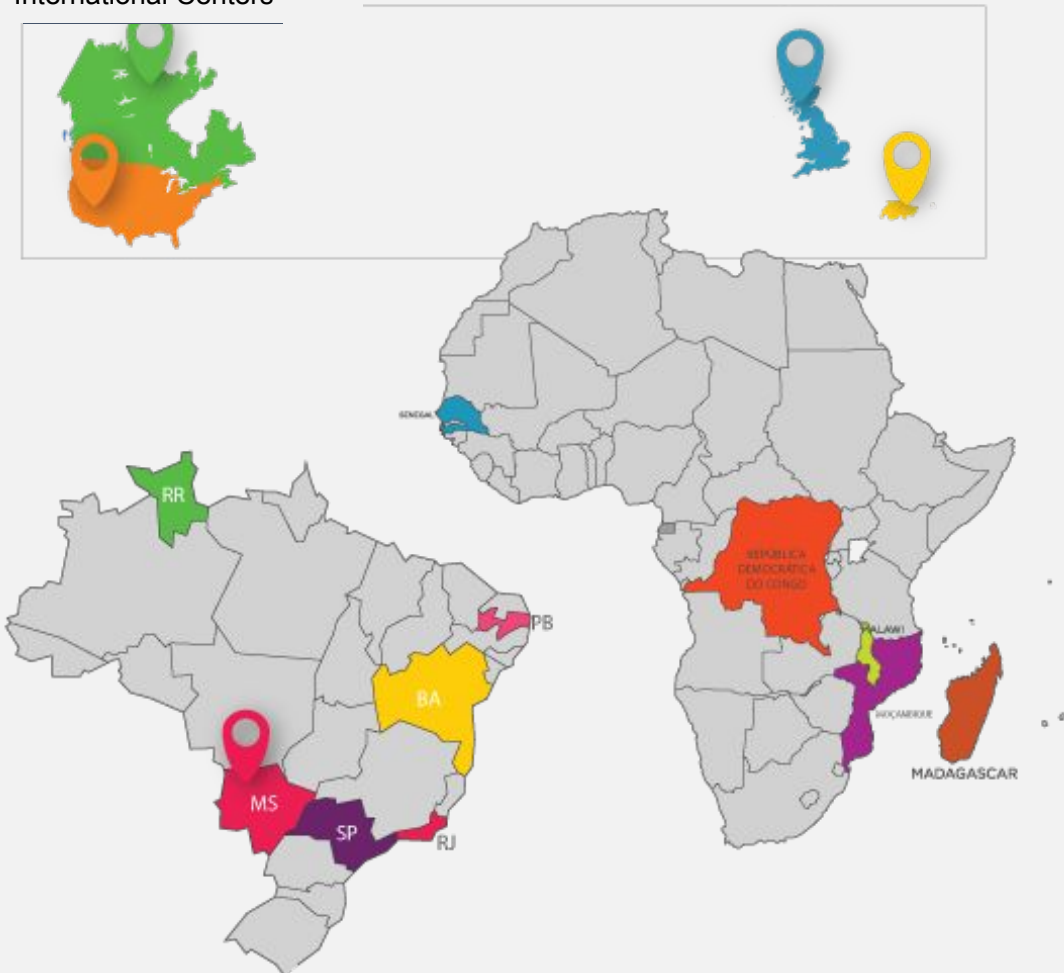

WHAT DO WE DO IN BRAZIL?

In Brazil, we maintain the **Fraternity Without Borders Orchestra Project**, which provides music education to young people from the suburbs. We help people who live on the streets through five **Fraternity on the Street** centers in four states in Brazil and in four cities in the United States. In the state of Mato Grosso do Sul, Brazil, such a support occurs through a partnership with **Clinic of the Soul**.

In Roraima, through **Brazil, a Welcoming Heart** project, we welcome migrant and refugee families from Venezuela, who cross the border into Brazil in search of a new life opportunity.

In partnership with Professor João Amorim Neto Research Institute, we support treatment for **children with microcephaly** in Campina Grande, in the state of PB, as well as in the state of MG, through **Portraits of Hope** project. We also have **Butterflies' Garden** project, in the state of BA, which supports children with Epidermolysis Bullosa.

WHAT DO WE DO IN AFRICA?

In Sub-Saharan Africa, we are active in **Madagascar, Mozambique, Malawi, and Democratic Republic of Congo**. On the West Coast, in **Senegal**, and in Central America, in **Haiti**.

We open and maintain shelter centers where we offer **food, hygiene and health care**, educational and cultural activities, as well as **vocational training**.

We support the elderly with food and by building houses for them.

We drill artesian wells in African villages and once water is supplied, we carry out **sustainable food planting**, by training young farmers and involving children in environmental education activities.

REALITY IN MADAGASCAR

Province: Toliara

City: Ambovombe - South of the Island of Madagascar

When we arrived in Madagascar in February **2017**, we found families living in extreme poverty, suffering from **hunger and thirst**.

Without access to water, children only bathed when it rained. **30% of these children had moderate to severe malnutrition**.

The families lived in very precarious houses, and the lack of hygiene and malnutrition caused diseases such as taeniasis, neurocysticercosis, chigoe flea, and other parasites or diseases.

Adults and children walk up to 6 km to get food, access water to bathe, brush their teeth and wash their clothes at our welcome centers..



THE GREAT FAMINE

More than **1.26 million** people in the south of the island of Madagascar are facing **serious food shortages**.

Hunger is expected to **increase** as plantations are devastated by sandstorms and a historic drought.

FOOD AND NUTRITION DATA

- + **1,300** monthly appointments at the Medical Clinic in Peace Camp.
- + **1,400** monthly nutritional monitoring
- + **3,000** per year, children are part of the vaccination, vitamins, and medical follow-up program to avoid malnutrition
- + **500** yearly prenatal care.
- + **900** family planning appointments per year
- + **400** hospitalizations per year.
- + **30** people with mental health problems in continued care at Vila Toby
- + **10** children receiving neurological stimulation.

THE EFOTAKE REGION PRESENTS THE MOST CHALLENGING SITUATION WE HAVE EVER ENCOUNTERED

SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN AGED 2 TO 5 YEARS FOR NUTRITIONAL ASSESSMENT

- We monitor the children's growth and weight gain to identify nutritional risks and intervene before the child becomes malnourished.
- Children **under 2 years of age** are followed up in nursing consultations.
- Those **older than 2 years** are assessed quarterly by the community health workers.
- Our goal now is to initiate partnerships to monitor children in elementary school in each rural district.



MEDICAL CARE IN MADAGASCAR

- Medical care is provided at the clinic in Ambovombe, in the Peace Camp. In 2018, the FWB served children under the age of 5 with a **malnutrition rate of 34%** and an **infant mortality rate of 9.6%**.
- In other regions, medical and nutritional assessments are carried out by a mobile team.
- The new clinic will provide even more capacity and easier access to the community.

WELLNESS AND HUMAN DIGNITY



- Emergency cases, medical care and nutritional treatments
- Two pavilions: 17 rooms and 18 hospital beds
- The team includes 3 doctors, 6 nurses and 8 community workers
- They are divided into community health education activities and child malnutrition assessments.

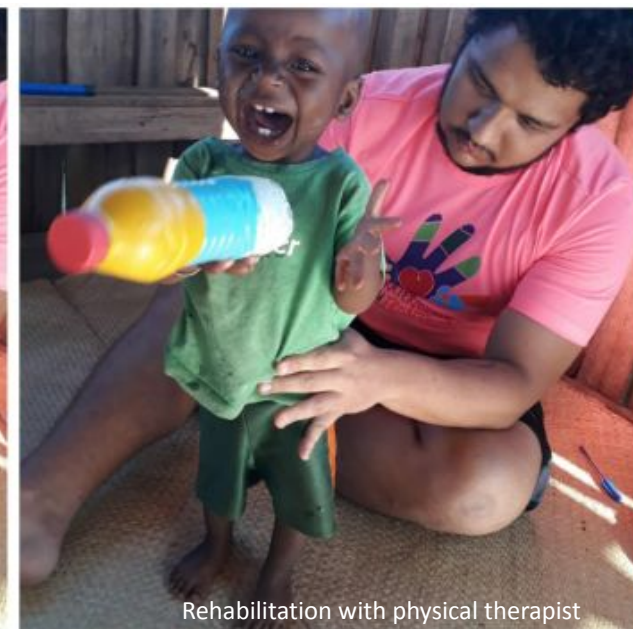
MALNUTRITION IS DANGEROUS FOR THE WHOLE BODY

- In recent years, the FWB has tracked the **seasonality of health problems** in Madagascar. Malnutrition coincides with periods of **drought** and poor harvests.
- Our radius of action already reached 20km, but **the number of cases has increased, and we need to extend our actions.**
- Many children arrive here unable to walk or sit up due to a severe malnutrition process.
- The recovery process requires not only weight gain but a whole new learning process.



REHABILITATION OF THE BODY AFTER MALNUTRITION

- The FWB involves doctors and physical therapists who train local teams to carry out motor and neurological rehabilitation activities for the children.
- Stimulation and rehabilitation are essential so that children can indeed resume their development.

THOSE CHILDREN NEED AN IMMEDIATE TREATMENT FOR SURVIVAL&RECOVERY

WHAT URGENT HELP THE CHILDREN IN NUTRITIONAL RISK NEED

- One of the goals of this humanitarian action is to benefit children over 1 year of age.
- To improve their nutritional conditions, milk powder is required. This milk will benefit 3,000 children only in the South of Madagascar.
- The monthly need is **40 bags** containing **25 kg** of **milk powder** per bag. The cost per bag is estimated at **\$140** (dollar).
- Yearly, those children will receive **480 bags** of milk powder costing **\$ 67,200**.

WHAT URGENT HELP THE CHILDREN IN NUTRITIONAL RISK NEED

- Another goal of this humanitarian action is to benefit 3,500 children under 1 year of age.
- Those children need to receive special milk supplements:
 - Nursie1 for babies from 0 to 6 months of age;
 - Nursie2 for babies from 7 to 12 months of age.
- The average **monthly** need is **92 boxes**, each box contains **6 cans of 900 grams**. The cost of the individual can is **\$ 20**, so each box costs **\$ 120**.
- Yearly, those children will receive **1104 boxes, 6,624 cans** costing **\$ 132,480**.

SOCIAL IMPACT OF THE MILK PROJECT

- The **social impact** of this Project will reach **6,500 Children** in the South of Madagascar.
- The table below summarizes the current need to save those children from bad nutrition conditions.

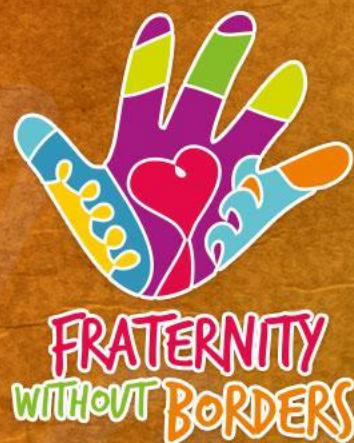
