## SUPPORTING COMMUNITY INITIATIVES THROUGH PARTNERSHIPS

### CURRENT ACTIVITIES

This past month, All Hands and Hearts (AHAH) has continued to make excellent progress converting **multi-purpose units (MPUs)**, delivering **seven temporary spaces** to individuals currently residing with relatives or friends while they await permanent housing. Each MPU accommodates up to four people, enabling families to remain together during this tumultuous time and alleviating the burden on their hosts.

At **Nāpili Noho Community Hub**, the team has been engaged in tasks such as food collection, inventory management, stocking and delivery. Nāpili Noho is a crucial resource and service center, providing essentials such as food, clothing, job assistance, childcare, tutoring and internet access. What began as a small operation of “families helping families” in Nāpili Park has evolved into a large, vital resource distribution and services center involving new daily teams of volunteers. Despite this growth, the hub remains run by the same core team, providing essential supplies and services to the community. AHAH’s efforts since arriving have involved supporting the work of Nāpili Noho, both with volunteer coordination and the distribution of essential items.

The team is continuing its partnerships with local organizations, including the **Hua Momona Farm Foundation** and the **Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement**. The Hua Momona Farm Foundation provides food for the underserved communities on Maui, including hot meals and fresh local produce. Volunteers have been busy working in the field to plant and harvest produce, and then supporting to prep over **1,000 hot meals distributed weekly** to the community.

## DISASTER PROFILE

High winds caused by Hurricane Dora, low humidity and a high-pressure system created terrible fire conditions in Hawaii, igniting multiple wildfires in August 2023. The wildfires have left towns in ruins, and with the death toll at 115, they mark the deadliest wildfires in the U.S. in over a century. The estimated damage totals approximately \$5.6 billion, with over 2,200 structures destroyed. Of these, 86% were residential, leaving 4,500 people internally displaced and temporarily relocated to hotels for shelter.

## OUR WORK

Since being contacted by the Hawaii Volunteer Organizations Active in Disaster (Hawaii VOAD), AHAH's initial response was to provide remote support, coordinating volunteers for local organizations – ensuring vital housing and resources were available for evacuees and internally displaced persons in the aftermath of the wildfires. Now, operating from the community of Lahaina, on Maui, AHAH is addressing the critical needs of those impacted.

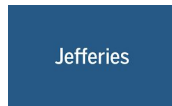
AHAH is building local partnerships to address the housing shortage. Lahaina alone witnessed the destruction of over 2,200 buildings, creating an immediate need for shelter. With hotels and resorts now moving temporarily-housed individuals out, the demand for housing is urgent. We are addressing the housing crisis by building temporary multi-purpose units for folks awaiting their permanent homes, hoping to expand our outreach as we deliver more units.
