


WHERE WE ARE


Currently, our schools are located in the Buenos Aires Conurbation, in areas adjacent to popular neighborhoods, with high socio-economic vulnerability according to the **Multiple Deprivation Index and high educational demand,** taking into account the Educational Offer Report from the General Directorate of Culture and Education of the Province of Buenos Aires.

In the present context our mission is indispensable



Only 3 out of every 100 students from poor backgrounds finish high school at the theoretical age and with satisfactory knowledge in language and mathematics

Only **17.5%** of young people from the lowest income decile are enrolled in higher education compared to **59.4%** of young people from the highest decile.


MARÍA DE GUADALUPE SCHOOL

700 students in kindergarten, elementary and high school

- Full-time schedule in a stimulating educational environment that promotes the development of 21st-century skills;
- Professionalizing curricular intensification in digital skills (high school with training itineraries);
- Culture of evaluation and continuous improvement;
- Situated and constant **teacher training**;
- **Personalized support** for each student (inclusive education);
- Permanent work with student's **families;** and
- Infrastructure and equipment suitable for educational purposes

LEARNING OUTCOMES National standardized tests - Aprender 2021

69% of 6th grade students achieved satisfactory and advanced levels of performance in Language, and 70% in Mathematics. These results are close to the average results of privately managed schools (77% satisfactory in Language and 72% in Mathematics) in Argentina, and to those of schools with a high socioeconomic level (78% satisfactory in Language and 75% in Mathematics).



In line with the mission, and based on the experience, learning, and achievements of María de Guadalupe School, the initiative for this new educational institution was born.


Rosario Vera Peñaloza School began its activities in March 2024 for 225 students in Kindergarten and Primary levels who live in situations of social vulnerability in Garín. It aims to achieve a complete educational offering up to the Secondary level for 1,125 students by 2031.





Today, 10% of the cost per student is supported by family contributions, 60% by state contributions, and the remaining 30% is sought through donations.

Each sponsor receives our periodic communications, two special reports with information on the students' educational results, newsletters, and special events invitations.
