

## Bangladesh Flood-2024 (Situation Review)

### Current Situation:

Heavy monsoon rains have been lashing northeastern and southeastern Bangladesh, as well as the neighboring Indian states of Meghalaya and Tripura. The region has been experiencing widespread rainfall due to low pressure over the Bay of Bengal.

1	Feni	Chattogram Division	Southeastern Bangladesh, near the Indian border (Tripura state), south of Cumilla, northwest of Chattogram.
2	Chattogram	Chattogram Division	Southeastern coast of Bangladesh along the Bay of Bengal, south of Feni and Cox's Bazar.
3	Cumilla	Chattogram Division	East-central Bangladesh, near the Indian border (Tripura state), north of Feni, south of Dhaka.
4	Noakhali	Chattogram Division	South-central Bangladesh, along the western bank of the Meghna River estuary, southwest of Feni.
5	Sylhet	Sylhet Division	Northeastern Bangladesh, near the Indian border (Meghalaya state), known for its tea gardens and hilly terrain.
6	Moulvibazar	Sylhet Division	Southeastern part of Sylhet Division, south of Sylhet city, close to the Indian border (Meghalaya state).
7	Brahmanbaria	Chattogram Division	East-central Bangladesh, northeast of Cumilla, west of the Indian state of Tripura.
8	Lakshmipur	Chattogram Division	South-central Bangladesh, on the western bank of the Meghna River, southwest of Noakhali.
9	Khagrachhari	Chattogram Division	Part of the Chattogram Hill Tracts, southeastern Bangladesh, near the Indian border (Tripura state), northeast of Chattogram city.
10	Cox's Bazar	Chattogram Division	Southeastern tip of Bangladesh along the Bay of Bengal coast, south of Chattogram, famous for having the world's longest natural sandy sea beach.

**Response:**

All UN agencies and other relief organizations including BRAC, BRCS, Islamic Relief Worldwide and Save the Children have responded immediately and are working on the ground.

Bangladeshi Army is carrying out rescue and relief activities as most of the affected areas is in heavy flood water and they are using helicopters and boats.
