

Report No. 2: Educating 250 Women in Gender-Based Violence (GBV) Prevention

In 2025, the project continued its work. Its overall objective is to train fifty (50) women leaders in Gender-Based Violence (GBV) prevention and response in the cities of Cartagena (25 women) and Cazucá (25 women). The project provides theoretical and practical training adapted to the learning style of adults, using a GBV teaching toolkit designed by the organization, which will serve as essential interactive material for the second stage of the project. In the second stage of the project, the women leaders (under the supervision of the organization) will be responsible for providing information to women and adolescents in the community through educational talks using the teaching kits. The final objective is to reach 300 women and adolescents in this phase. This approach aims not only to raise awareness about the implications of violence against women and its various manifestations, but also to provide effective options for its prevention, awareness of care options, and rights.

As of August 2025, the following progress has been made in Phase I.

1. Needs assessment in the Cazucá community, El Progreso sector.

Visits were conducted in the community on December 14 and August 15. The work done during these visits is as follows:

- Focus groups: Four (6) focus groups have been conducted to date.
- Interviews with key stakeholders: Ten (10) interviews have been conducted with women from the community.

2. Adaptation of educational content.

The educational content was defined:



The first training session was held with twelve (12) volunteers attending, who wish to participate and replicate it in the community. The topics covered are shown in the slides.

3. Training development.



The training will initially take place in two four-hour sessions. The first was held on July 12th and the second will be on September 27th.

After these dates, those designated to attend the training will provide in-depth coverage of the topic.
