The Teenage Mothers Vocational Training Center (TMVTC) remains a vital initiative at the heart of MaSe Foundation Uganda's mission to empower young mothers in Kampungu village, Kalisizo town, Kyotera district. Designed to equip teenage mothers with vocational skills, reproductive health knowledge, and economic empowerment tools, the center was envisioned as a transformative space offering training in tailoring, entrepreneurship, financial literacy, and child care.

Unfortunately, despite the strong community interest and clear need for such a facility, the project has not yet launched due to limited funding. The enthusiasm and readiness of the local community to engage with the center remain high, and MaSe Foundation continues to advocate for the resources necessary to bring this vision to life.
