RE: ANNUAL REPORT ABOUT KASESE HUMANIST SCHOOL – UGANDA

INTRODUCTION:

Kasese Humanist School is a secular school built on the foundation of science and cherishes humanist values. It stresses for compassion, reason and tolerance and teaches the Uganda nursery, primary and secondary school curriculum, Examinations Finals at Primary and Secondary levels are set by Uganda National Examinations Board and the schools are regulated and licensed by the Ministry of Education and Sports.

Our secondary wing operates under the name of Municipal High School Kasese and runs classes Senior 1 to Senior 4. We offer ordinary level secondary education; the school is registered by the Ministry of Education and Sports and has a UNEB sitting center number.

STAFFING: We have a team of **34 teachers and 8 non-teaching staffs** at all the campuses for the nursery and primary schools.

SCHOOL SUSTAINABLE INITIATIVES:

- We have got **farming spaces** both on campus and in different areas that help provide food for the school. Some of these gardening works is supported with donations.
- We have the **Bizoha backpackers hostel , Auto Garage facility and Bizoha hostel muhokya** which generate income for the schools.
- We continue to offer free farm lands to our teachers and enthusiastic students who are passionate about gardening and agriculture in general, they plant their own food to uplift their livelihoods.
- We have provided shelters to our teachers in different places, giving teachers free accommodation.
- We have intensified our tree planting campaigns, added more tree seedlings to create a bigger forest around our rukoki campus.
- We have planted scores of coffee seedlings on our muhokya Rutoke land in our attempts to create a coffee farm which will be generating some income in two years' time.

Recent school infrastructural developments:

- We have uplifted our school library with more book resources from Uganda Humanist Schools Trust. Biblionef, Darien book aid to mention but a few.
- We have stocked well our science laboratory with essential reagents and apparatuses courtesy of Uganda Humanist Schools trust UK and a German charity called Scientific Temper.
- We have uplifted our girls and boys dormitory at the Rukoki campus and furnished it with more beds, mosquito nets.
- We received a mega donation of sanitary pads early this year we have been distributing them out throughout the year at different times and on different campuses that we run. Thanks to Uganda Humanist Schools trust and the Ethical Society of St.Luio.
- The School Directors office constructed a school kitchen from scratch and built a modern cooking area which is improved and taking less wood fuel , the facility has a kitchen and food store and its smoke free.
- We planted trees inside the Kahendero school compound to ensure there is a tree greener environment to provide shade, fresh air and sense of comfort to the children and staffs at this school.
- There has been addition of more sheltering spaces for the girls and boys on fullboard at the Rukoki campus. More Dorm space for the girls. Another 7 more rooms are soon to be completed before this year closes.
- There has been tremendous inflow of donations from Global Giving under our Sponsor a Child at Kasese Humanist School, these funds have helped in paying tuition ,scholastics, School uniforms and some medical first aid to the more than 75 needy orphans under our care.

- At different times throughout the year, we do receive generous funds collected from generous donors, child sponsors and well-wishers via Atheist Alliance International, these funds have boosted me in paying salaries, buying scholastics like uniforms, pens, pencils, exercise books to the many orphans under our care.
- We are currently expanding our boys dormitory by adding more six rooms to shelter more full board boy students and expanding our Girls dormitory by adding one more bigger space to shelter more 10 full board Girl students.

Municipal High school Kasese is a secular school built on the foundation of science and cherishes humanist values and provides an inclusive education based on compassion, reason and tolerance. The school is mixed, welcomes children from all backgrounds and does not discriminate on tribe, gender, religion or belief.

This school is the secondary wing of Kasese Humanist School and right now has a total number of 102 Students.

TEACHING AND NON TEACHING STAFFS:

The school has a teaching staff of 14 and a Non-teaching staff of 5 employed at the school. They comprise of the following: secretary/bursar, librarian, matron, gate keeper and cook and this makes the total number of staffs to 19

SCHOOL PROGRAMS:

- We teach both **Arts and Sciences** as specified by the Uganda secondary School syllabus and curriculum in general.
- We also teach **Humanism, Humanist values and principles.**

- We practice **vocational skills** training in tailoring, wood work, arts and craft making, auto mechanics and garage services and welding.
- **Gardening activities** around the school are encouraged.
- **Tree planting campaigns:** Our school is engaged in tree planting campaigns to respond to calls of environmental protection and climate change.
- **School clubs:** We have several clubs like the Humanist club, Science club, Entrepreneur club, Debate Club and the Wildlife Club.

SCHOOL CHALLENGES:

- Our computer lab operates in a small room and there is a need for a spacious computer room.
- Most of our students are unprivileged especially the orphans and those coming from poor backgrounds whose parents struggle to pay school fees.
- Some of our teachers are licensed and need to further or upgrade their education in order to fit in the teaching fraternity.
- With the revised secondary school curriculum, some efforts still lack in vocational subjects as in tools and other related instructional materials.
- We continue requesting for more lab supplies and reagents so that we keep our school lab up-to-date.
- We need additional beds, mattresses and mosquito nets to give out to some of children in our hostel
- We need additional classroom furniture to add in our classrooms and to replace worn out old classroom desks.
- High water bills and we are looking forward to installing more rainwater harvesting tanks and drilling a bore hole to create a well at the rukoki campus for improving health and sanitation.
- Additional computers to add in our schools at the different campuses are highly needed.
- We require a sick bay and a mini health unit to attend to the medical needs and first aid to our sick children on campus.

SCHOOL SUCCESSES:

- We are built on our permanent home with permanent buildings
- Our school is connected to the power and water grid.
- We have improved on the appearance of all our campuses at Rukoki, Muhokya and Kahendero.
- We uplifted our school library at rukoki and its now in good shape and well stocked.
- We improved our boys and girls dormitories and added metallic double decker beds courtesy of UHST and other individual donors.
- We added more text books and learning resources with support from UHST, Darien Book Aid.
- We added more two desktop computers to our computer room donated by the Scientific Temper charity based in Germany.
- We have successfully produced candidates who have graduated into teachers, nurses, mechanics, drivers, business persons and small scale business owners in various disciplines.

Others are still advancing in tertiary institutions to be doctors, lawyers, engineers to mention but a few.

- We have succeeded in creating more partnerships and collaboration with global charities like GLOBAL GIVING whose support is adding a positive impact by encouraging more needy children to get education at our schools.
