

Project Overview: Food Aid Support for Butebo

Total Budget: \$250,000

Objective: To provide emergency food relief to widows, orphans, and vulnerable families in Butebo District, Uganda, addressing the urgent issue of food insecurity due to droughts and poor harvests.

Problem Statement:

Butebo District faces severe food insecurity due to frequent droughts and poor harvests. With 88.3% of households dependent on subsistence farming, many families, including widows, orphans, and the elderly, experience food shortages and are left with only one meal per day. The lack of adequate infrastructure further limits access to markets, making it difficult to improve food availability. This project will provide immediate food relief to the most vulnerable and ensure their survival during periods of food scarcity.

Project Goals:

1. **Emergency Food Distribution:** Provide essential food items, including grains, beans, cooking oil, and other nutritional supplies, to 1,000 vulnerable families, including widows, orphans, and the elderly.
2. **Promote Food Security:** Support local farming initiatives to improve future harvests and reduce dependence on external aid by introducing sustainable agricultural techniques.
3. **Community Support:** Engage local leaders and community members in distribution to ensure transparency and equitable access to food supplies.

Budget Breakdown (\$250,000):
