ORGANIZATIONAL BACKGROUND

Children's Future International (CFI) established in 2009 as a community based organization works to improve the lives of vulnerable, marginalized and at risk children in Ek Phnom district, Battambang, Cambodia by providing access to quality education; promoting child rights; ensuring physical safety; health and wellness; inspiring children and young adults to act as positives role models within their communities; fostering self-reliance among families and communities; sharing joy together.

This year is CFI's 15th year anniversary. We celebrated the occasion with an event held on the site for our future home. Next, we held a ribbon cutting ceremony to inaugurate our new library. We had various representatives help cut the ribbon to represent our children, youth, management team, the contractor, architect, board members, board president and founder.

We had four speeches by our Executive Director, Patrice Davison, one of our founders, Jenny Ciucci, a representative from former students and Board Member, Roeurn Sokha, and the President of our Board of Representatives, Susie Johnston. They shared about the history of CFI, current work, and their hopes for the future.

After the formal ceremony, we had a number of hands-on activities for children and participants. We planted 17 traditional Khmer trees around the future playground area to make shade in the years that come. 


In the afternoon, we provided lunch and had games and dancing for the students, raffle prizes for the adults, and certificates of appreciation for the event sponsors and volunteers.
