Executive Summary

Project Description

Phase 1: Initial Setup and Community Engagement

- **Needs Assessment and Planning: \$1,500**
 - Hiring consultants or experts to conduct a comprehensive needs assessment.
 - Developing a detailed project plan, including timelines, milestones, and budget.
- **Community Outreach and Mobilization: \$1,000**
 - Organizing community meetings, workshops, and focus groups.
 - Creating promotional materials (e.g., flyers, posters, social media content) to raise awareness.
 - Building partnerships with local organizations and government agencies.

Phase 2: Infrastructure Development and Renovation

- **Building Renovation and Repairs: \$11,000**



- Hiring contractors for structural repairs, electrical work, plumbing, and painting.

 - **Program Food, Materials and Supplies: \$5,000**
 - Providing lunch, snacks and refreshments for participants.
 - Purchasing books, workbooks, and other materials for workshops and training sessions.

Phase 4: Monitoring, Evaluation, and Reporting

- **Data Collection and Analysis: \$2,000**



- Developing data collection tools (e.g., surveys, checklists) to track progress.
- Analyzing data to inform program adjustments and decision-making.

- **Reporting and Communication: \$1,000**

- Preparing regular progress reports and impact assessments.
- Creating newsletters, social media posts, and other communication materials.
