OUR MISSION TODAY

Despite decades of progress in the fight against hunger, hunger levels are rising again. **60 million more people are suffering from hunger right now than there were in 2014.**² Why?

EXTREME POVERTY

Costs of food, fertilizer, and agricultural inputs have risen due to lingering effects of the COVID-19, the war in Ukraine, and other economic shocks. Without sufficient and sustainable incomes, families cannot afford access to nutritious food, clean water, or health care.

CLIMATE SHOCKS

From floods in Pakistan to the unprecedented drought in the Horn of Africa, climate shocks are driving people from their homes and destroying livelihoods.

DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES

Disasters and emergencies have become much more frequent due to climate change, cross-border conflict, and urbanization.

CHRONIC INEQUALITY

Women, displaced people and refugees, and those with disabilities face chronic inequality: they are more likely to experience barriers to essential services, jobs, income, resources, and unequal access to nutritious food.

One in five people in Africa are facing hunger, and that number is growing faster than in any other region of the world. In East Africa alone, over 3.5 million children are in dire need of proper nutrition³ and 32.6% of children do not properly grow.⁴

WE ARE ACTION AGAINST HUNGER, the first nonprofit focused exclusively on ending global hunger.



INNOVATE SOLUTIONS FOR SYSTEMIC CHANGE



For example, our teams have advanced:



The **first therapeutic formula** to treat malnourished children, now used all over the world by nonprofits and local governments.

Predictive statistical and computational modelling



to identify early risks and anticipate malnutrition. Soon, we will be able to proactively address and prevent the worst effects of conflict or climate changes, rather than responding after their peaks.



A **life-saving app** that, with a photo of a child's arm, screens for malnutrition, allowing us to proactively deploy interventions to address childhood stunting.



Methods to **collaborate with a small army of majority women volunteers** to treat hunger themselves in remote, under-resourced villages.

Ways to use **real-time artificial intelligence and data** to increase pastoral farmers' resiliency to droughts, heatwaves, bushfires, and even COVID-19 closures by helping them find available pasture stock.
