




OPPORTUNITY


FROM FEAR TO COMPASSION AND UNITY

BECOME A STREET DOG HERO



LEVEL 1 DONATE \$1,000

Could cover medicine and supplies needed to move 10 patients from hurt to healed.



LEVEL 2 DONATE \$2,500

Could cover medicine and supplies to **sterilize** and vaccinate 200 street dogs



LEVEL 3 DONATE \$5,000

Could cover **1 months salary** for the **15** staff members working tirelessly in India.
