OUR SERVICES

Caring Section

- ★ Developmental interventions for children aged 3 to 21.
- ★ Transitioning children to Special Needs Schools, Inclusive Education, or our Sheltered Employment Section.
- ★ Addressing the unique needs of children with severe and profound mental disabilities.
- ★ Offering specialized education and training.
- ★ Advocating for their Right to Education as enshrined in our Constitution.

Service Section

- ★ Tailored care and programs for children with profound disabilities.
- ★ Specialized classes for children with Cerebral Palsy and Autism.
- ★ Small class ratios (1:6 caregiver to beneficiary) for personalized attention.
- ★ Grouping beneficiaries based on individual intellectual and developmental levels.
- ★ Providing indigenous language therapy and Alternative Augmentative Communication classes for children with hearing and/or speech impairments.
- ★ Equipped classrooms, including Toy, Music, and Sports Libraries.
- ★ Focusing on the development of social and life skills. Implementing individual programs crafted by our Occupational ECD Therapist.
- ★ Offering Home Based Programs to support parents and minimize disruptions to children's routines. Daily nutritional feeding programs (breakfast, snack, and lunch).
- ★ Transport to and from the Centre for children. Providing Social Services, including parent support, counseling by Social Workers, and assistance with screening and processing of social and disability grants.
- ★ Enabling participation in Special Olympics sports and organizing educational outings.
