Another milestone was our community engagement and exchange, which allowed us to build global connections while representing UniCoN in some communities of Vietnam, Singapore, Indonesia, and the USA.

As we move into 2025, we aim to broaden our reach, enhance program quality, and build new partnerships to create deeper, more impactful change, with a focus on Green Social Work to address pressing community needs.

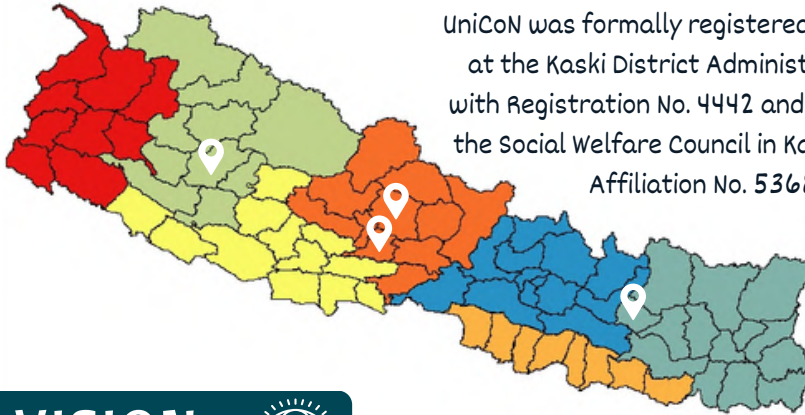

WHO WE ARE?

United Community Nepal (UniCoN) is a non-governmental, not-for-profit social organization founded by a group of young professionals during COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 as a response to the inadequate social protections for vulnerable population groups.



UniCoN was formally registered in March 2022 at the Kaski District Administration Office with Registration No. 4442 and affiliated with the Social Welfare Council in Kathmandu with Affiliation No. 53686.

VISION



To strengthen the capacity of the most disadvantaged, underserved, and vulnerable populations, especially women, children, dalits, and people living in remote geographic areas, through learning opportunities that integrate culture, innovation, and economy for a brighter and sustainable future.

MISSION



UniCoN envisions a society where every individual, regardless of their background, has access to opportunities that empower them to thrive and contribute meaningfully to their communities. It aims to create transformative change for disadvantaged and stigmatized communities by expanding access to employment, civil rights, quality education, and sustainable livelihoods.

GOAL



By 2030, we aim to improve living conditions and create opportunities for at least 10,000 marginalized and stigmatized women and children through our powerful programs and services.



Our target groups:



We primarily work with economically, socially, politically, and culturally marginalized communities in Nepal.

We prioritize three population groups:

Women & Girls, Children & Youth, and Persons with Disabilities.

We recognize that within these key groups, people are further disadvantaged if they are Dalits or are Indigenous.

1 Community Learning Program

Empowering Children
through After-School Support



Children aged
3 to 15 years

This project is providing children with educational resources & support, developmental opportunities, and a safe learning environment.

Currently, we have an active learning center in Ramkot, Syangja, where 33 children receive facilitated learning sessions tailored to their needs. Our two facilitators work closely with these children, particularly those whose parents are unable to provide educational support due to financial or social constraints.

The program bridges learning gaps, builds confidence, and empowers children to achieve personal and academic growth.



2 Aviation Education






Introducing Aviation Concepts and
Awareness about Aerospace Careers

This program brings the program model of the AeroStar Avion Institute from Chicago, USA, to Pokhara, Nepal, for the very first time.

Since 2023, we have been working with four schools (Siddha, Kalika, Amar Singh, and Pokhara Public Secondary School) directly impacting over 140 students from Grades 8 and 9 through engaging weekly after-school sessions.



Our program is a blend of:

-  Theoretical Knowledge and Practical Learning: Equipping students with aviation concepts.
-  Providing exposure to Pokhara International Airport operations through airport visits
-  Motivational Sessions with Aviation Role Models: Inspiring students to dream big and explore careers in the aviation industry.

3 E-STEM

E-STEM, integrating Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) education with environmental awareness to inspire students to develop innovative solutions for sustainable development.

The main highlights of this project are:



The project is currently implementing in four public schools in Pokhara benefiting 120 secondary level students.

Teacher Training and Professional Development to enhance teachers' skills in delivering innovative, student-centered STEM lessons.

Robotics trainings, STEM clubs formation and after-school sessions.

STEM Competitions and Camps

Mentorship and Industry Exposure to expose students to real-world applications of STEM and inspire them to pursue careers in these fields.



4 Football4Future

Soar into Sports with Wings of Hope

This project empowers youth, especially girls, fostering their holistic development, self-confidence, and life skills through football.

Directly benefiting 146 students of 5 secondary schools—Shree Amar Singh, Barahi, Kanya, Shiva Shakti, and Sitaladevi through various skill development sessions.

5 Gender Equity and Social Action (GESA)

- a transformative community-based education initiative.

Through our Gender Equity Social Action (GESA) program, we equip adolescents with knowledge, skills, peer support and mentoring to challenge harmful gender norms.



The GESA program was launched in September 2024. With financial and technical support from the I Am Women Project (IAW), a 5-day 'Action for Equality' (AfE) Mentor Development Training Program was run for 28 participants. Using an experiential learning model of facilitation led by Pune-based NGO the Equal Community Foundation (ECF), we learned how to equip young people with the tools to bring about gender equity in families and communities.

Participants attending the training came from five NGOs (Karma Flights, Kopila Nepal, CWSN, GONESA, and UniCoN), as well as social work students from Pokhara University and Lake City College in Pokhara.

Currently we are rolling out the 15-session ECF AfE curriculum in rural communities of Kaski and Syangja districts for young people aged from 13 to 17 years of age.

Gender Equity & Social Action

Focus Group Discussion Program

Pokhara, Nepal



The long term goal of our GESA program is to tackle the root causes of gender inequality by addressing power imbalances between genders, thereby challenging restrictive gender roles which damage both boys and girls.

UniCoN applauds IAW for this important collaboration. Together we are working to create impactful learning opportunities for marginalized groups which aligns with our vision of holistic and inclusive community empowerment.

6 Bio-diversity

UniCoN and Mitra Samaj Nepal partnered on USAID-Supported project to Advance Environmental Conservation in Pokhara.



5 Roundtable Discussion sessions were conducted in Pokhara, Syangja and Parbat, with a major focus on five key thematic areas related to eco-system health, biodiversity conservation, and climate resilience. These dialogues brought together diverse stakeholders, including local governments, civil society organizations, and community members, to discuss critical environmental challenges and to explore sustainable solutions.

Creative Writing Training for Local Journalists

UniCoN also organized a Creative Writing Training on Environmental Conservation for 20 local journalists in Pokhara. This training aimed to enhance the participants' skills in crafting impactful content to raise awareness about pressing environmental issues and advocate for sustainable practices.



Green Social Work (GSW)



UniCoN applies the GSW framework across all its programs and services, an innovative approach that integrates environmental and social justice. This framework addresses the interconnected challenges of climate change, inequality, and community well-being.

GSW highlights social workers' vital role in fostering resilience and promoting eco-friendly practices. By connecting environmental and social issues, GSW empowers our communities to co-create inclusive, sustainable solutions to climate challenges, ensuring that vulnerable populations, particularly women and marginalized groups, take the lead in climate action.

7 University Collaboration:

Field Education Opportunities

Since 2023, UniCoN has been offering valuable field education placements to social work students, both locally and internationally.

In 2024, we had the pleasure of hosting Ms. Chloe Dhillon from La Trobe University, Australia, for a three-month field placement.

As part of La Trobes' International Social Work Stream, students can undertake placement in Nepal in order to learn more about the role of social workers in an international context.

Local Internships

UniCoN partnered with Lake City College and Research Center in Pokhara to offer internship opportunities to Bachelor Level social work students. This year, Ms. Martha Hitang and Mr. Basanta Karki were placed with UniCoN for three months, gaining hands-on experience in social work focused on education, women's empowerment, and livelihood support programs.

INTERNATIONAL PLACEMENT

In my time with UniCoN, I supported the creation of the Gender Equity and Social Action (GESA) program, which involved undertaking five days of training with many other wonderful NGOs and community workers from around Pokhara. 8 Community Exchange Program

Women Empowerment

The Success of the Eco-Bag Program



In 2023, UniCoN initiated an eco-friendly bag production training program for 27 mothers in Ramkot village. This small yet impactful initiative has now transformed into a sustainable livelihood opportunity for these women. After completing the 2-month training, the participants not only honed their skills but also took an important step forward by forming a registered micro-enterprise with the support of Fedikhola Rural Municipality. The municipality provided the group with 12 sewing machines to scale up their production. Today, these women are actively producing eco-bags and selling them in local markets in Pokhara, generating income to support their families.

What makes this initiative truly impactful is the way it seamlessly integrates with their daily lives. The women utilize their time efficiently,

working in groups at the community learning center from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM while their children are at school.

UniCoN has been able to empower women with the means to be self-sufficient, reinforcing the belief that economic independence is a key driver of social change. This journey from training to entrepreneurship is a testament to what can be achieved when communities, organizations, and local authorities come together to support meaningful initiatives.

As we look ahead, we expect to expanding such programs, ensuring more women have access to opportunities that enhance their livelihoods and contribute to a greener, more sustainable future.

Advance Environmental Conservation Efforts Host community workshops on Green Social Work to raise awareness about climate change and mobilize local action.

Grow the **Football4Future program** to reach 5 additional schools, empowering 300 more students through football skill development, life skills training, and gender equality advocacy.

Enhance Organizational Capacity and Partnerships: Strengthen partnerships with local governments, private organizations, and international stakeholders.

Improve Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) systems to ensure transparency and measurable impact.

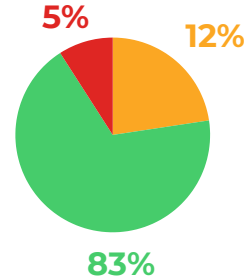

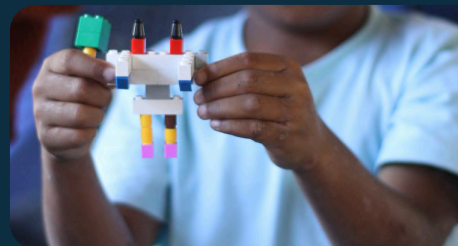
