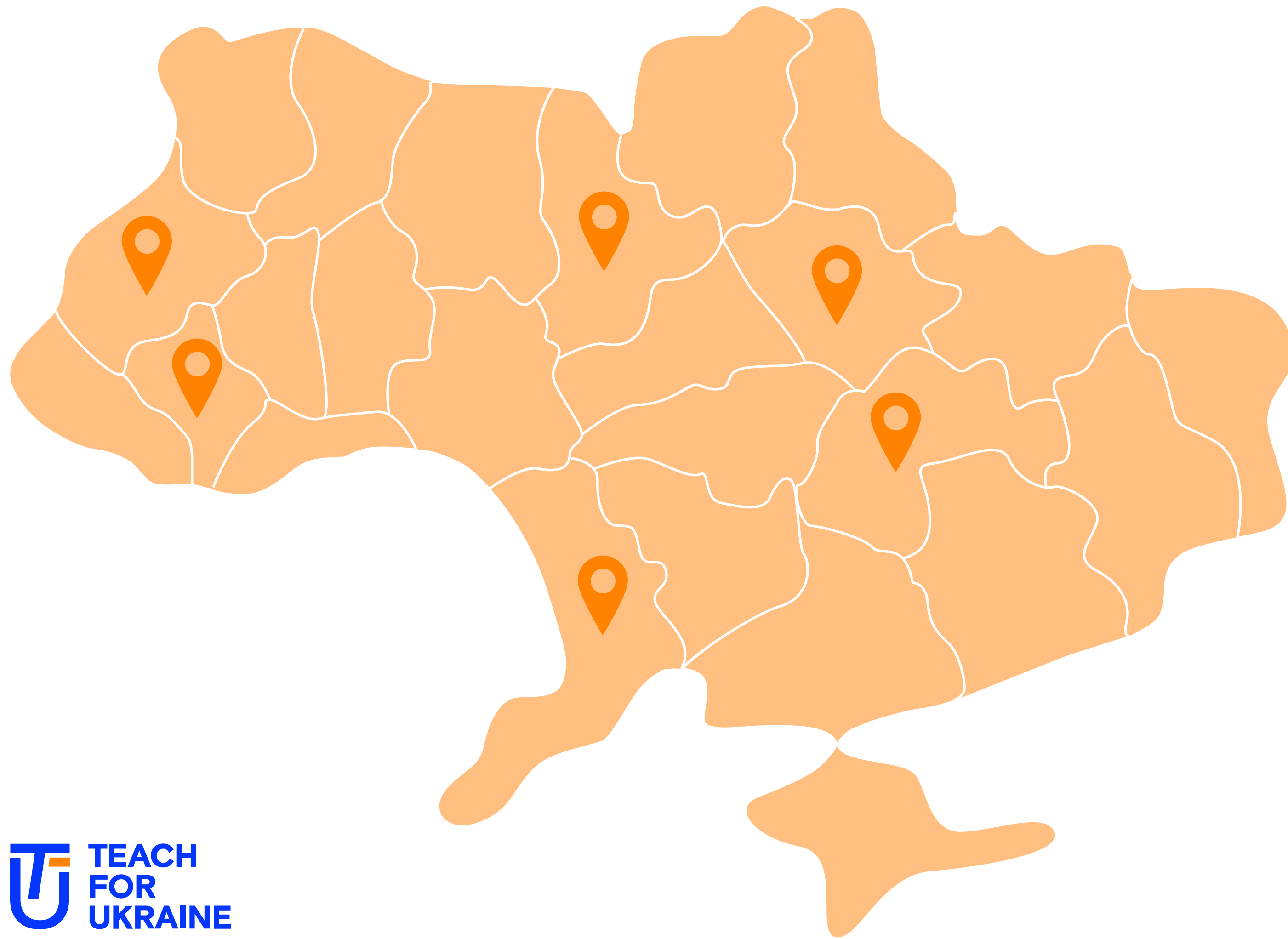

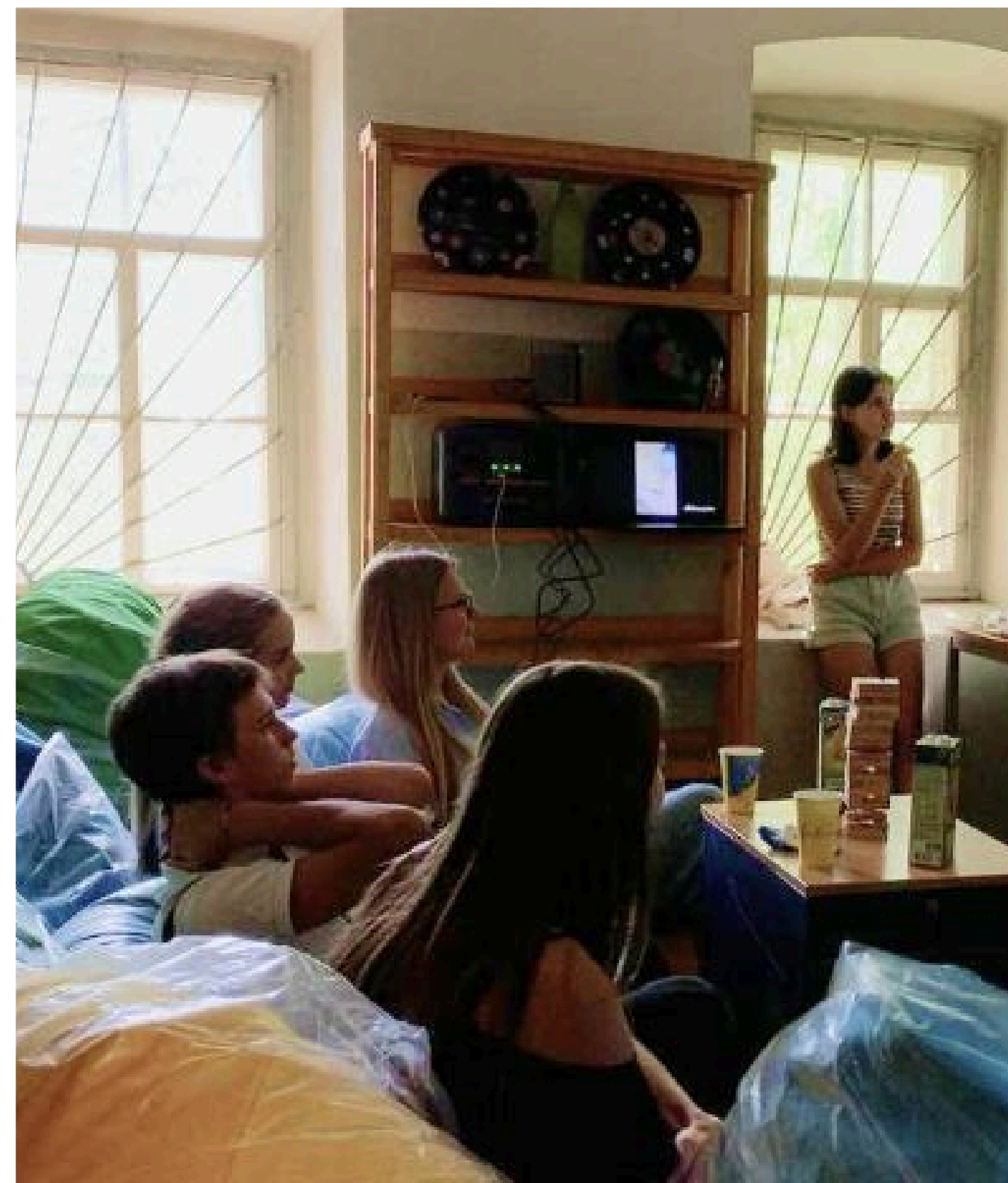

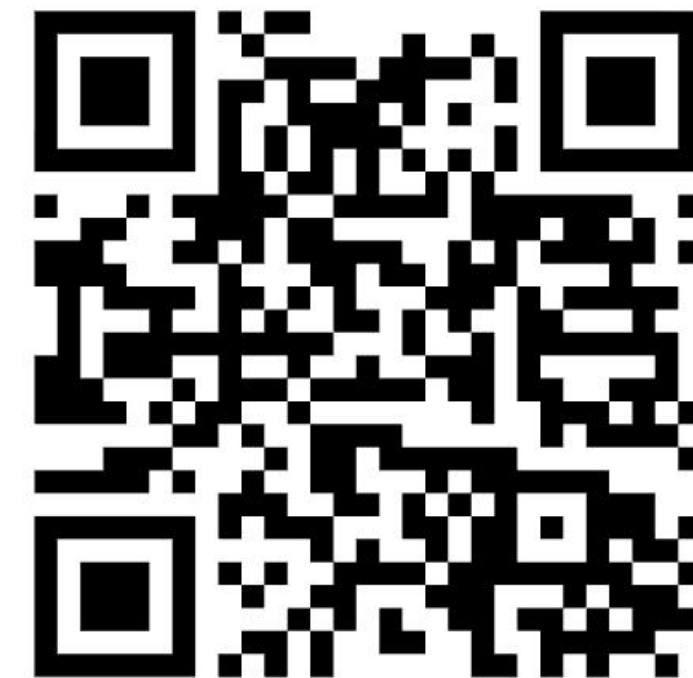
A New Definition of “Normal”

In Ukraine today, “normal” means learning under sirens. It means classrooms that move underground — into basements, corridors, and newly built shelters.

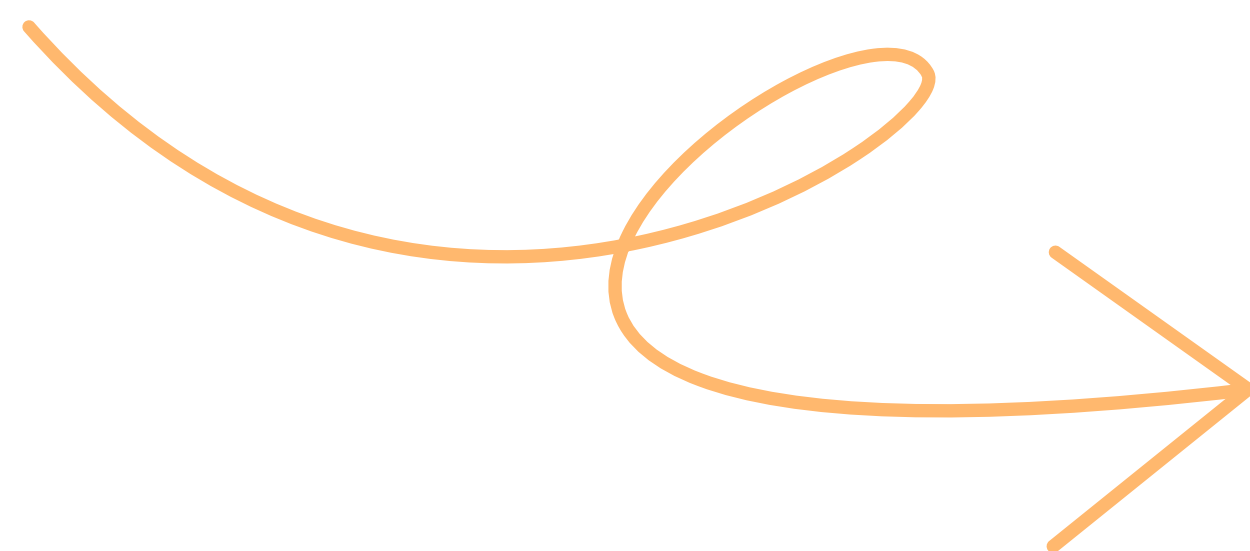
Across the country, teachers like Olena, Kateryna, and Elizabeth, Teach For Ukraine fellows, keep lessons going through air raid alerts, turning small, crowded shelters into places of learning and safety.

Some children do math by flashlight; others paint walls to make their shelters feel alive again. Even underground, the rhythm of learning continues, proving that for Ukraine’s schools, normal now means resilience.

OUR BIGGEST ACHIEVEMENTS THIS QUARTER



Expanded Alumni Leadership Programs: awarded 7 grants totaling 500,000 UAH, facilitated 3 alumni internship placements within the Ministry of Education, and piloted the Alumni Mentoring Program with 15 fellows and alumni paired with 9 mentors.



Launched the Impulse Program, training school teams from 8 frontline and de-occupied regions as Youth Mental Health Ambassadors to strengthen well-being in schools.



Contributed to global evidence on education in emergencies with the World Bank publication of the randomized control trial, showing substantial improvements in student learning and socio-emotional outcomes.



Launched the new TFU website, which drove a 200% increase in traffic, providing a central hub for program information, media coverage, and participant registration.



Released two educational series on Diia.Education, supporting teachers and young educators.
