

Success Story: From Dependency to Determination

In 2025, Amani Transformational Foundation's Rise and Thrive Project chose to support young women in the heart of the Moyo community, embarking on a journey that would test their resilience and transform their lives.

Before the project, Ms. Sarah (pseudonym), a 31-year-old mother, lived with constant uncertainty. She had no stable source of income and relied entirely on her family for basic needs. Like many young women in her situation, she dreamed of independence but lacked the opportunity and skills to make it a reality. In April 2025, hope arrived in the form of 21 Kenbro chicks. The girls received technical training and dove into poultry farming together. They woke up early to feed the birds, maintained strict hygiene standards, and supported one another through the learning curve.

The journey was not easy. A sudden disease outbreak claimed 10 chicks, threatening to crush their dreams. Feed costs rose, and the birds required constant care. Yet, the group refused to give up. Through teamwork, continuous learning, and determination, they successfully raised the remaining 11 birds to market size. In a proud moment, they sold the chickens at UGX 15,000 each, generating a total of UGX 165,000. While the income was modest, its impact was profound. Instead of spending it all on immediate needs, the group made a wise collective decision: they invested most of the money into renovating their poultry house. This repair strengthened protection against weather, predators, and future diseases laying a stronger foundation for long-term success.

Ms. Sarah's colleague Beatrice echoes this transformation;

"The income was not large, but the experience changed me. My confidence has grown, my skills have improved, and our group has become stronger. I now believe in my ability to succeed in poultry farming."
