# FROM THE EXECUTIVE TEAM

---



**Dear friends,**

We are proud to share Do Good Multnomah's 2023 impact report with you. On the following pages you will see our numbers and metrics, but more importantly, we hope you will take the time to reflect on the stories of those who have been profoundly impacted by our mission to journey side-by-side with Veterans and other underserved communities so that all individuals are seen, supported, and valued while navigating shelter and housing. Together, we are answering the call to end Veteran homelessness and the past year has marked significant progress toward that goal.

Since the beginning of Do Good, our work has been grounded in providing dignified sheltering opportunities, and in the past year **we served 1,141 unique individuals and were able to provide 222 people with next-step housing options**. Also, through our permanent supportive housing programs, **we provided 84 Veterans with four walls and a place to call home** and robust supportive services to maintain and sustain that housing.

Another significant milestone in Do Good's journey this year has been expanding our work to provide 24/7 shelter and bridge housing services as part of the Behavioral Health Resource Center (BHRC) in downtown Portland. This intensely collaborative program was intentionally designed to be peer-led and trauma-informed. Do Good has been honored to take on this innovative work alongside the Mental Health & Addiction Association of Oregon (MHA AO).

Across all programs, **we served over 228,855 meals** to participants in our shelters, offered over **3,765 personal hygiene and self-care items** to those just entering shelter, and welcomed **over 130 volunteers** as they supported the needs of our community. Thank you to all those who have supported this good work, whether through monetary support or by showing up and providing staffing for care clinics, restocking our clothing closet, or celebrating Ruck March Rockstars.

Your support allows us to further support our Veterans as they strengthen their mental health and build community. Opportunities to spend a carefree day at the Oregon Coast, join family at the Oregon Zoo, watch the Blazers at the Moda Center, and tend to garden beds have all been made possible with gifts from you. Thank you for enriching our Veterans' lives.

Looking into the future, the need to continue the work is clear and we have groundbreaking (literally!) efforts underway to make the dream of ending Veteran homelessness in the Portland-metro region a reality.

## THE CHALLENGE

---

In Oregon, there are currently **1,460+ houseless Veterans**

**Rent increased 14.6%** in the greater Portland Metro area in the last year

**13,000+ people are unhoused** in Oregon on any given night

The number of Oregon **families experiencing homelessness increased by 16%** between 2022 and 2023

Veterans are over-represented among the unhoused. 7% of the national population has served in the military, yet **18% of adults in homeless shelters are Veterans**

Nationally, the number of Veterans who experienced homelessness in 2023 rose by **7.4%** from the previous year to **35,574**

## WHY PORTLAND NEEDS US

---

Gov. Tina Kotek has declared a “housing state of emergency” for the state of Oregon. This is the 5th time since 2015. During that time, the **number of houseless individuals in Portland skyrocketed from 1,887 to 6,297**. Our region is desperate for solutions and needs experienced service providers to answer the call.

The average Portland rent increased by 14.6% in the last year, which deeply affects housing access in our area. These realities have a higher impact on **Veterans, who are 2–3.5x times more likely to experience homelessness than other U.S. citizens**. This population is more vulnerable to housing issues due to the physical, mental, and social stresses that can follow military service. According to the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs, homelessness among U.S. Veterans increased by 7.4% to 35,564 in the last year, including 15,507 Veterans who are still unsheltered.

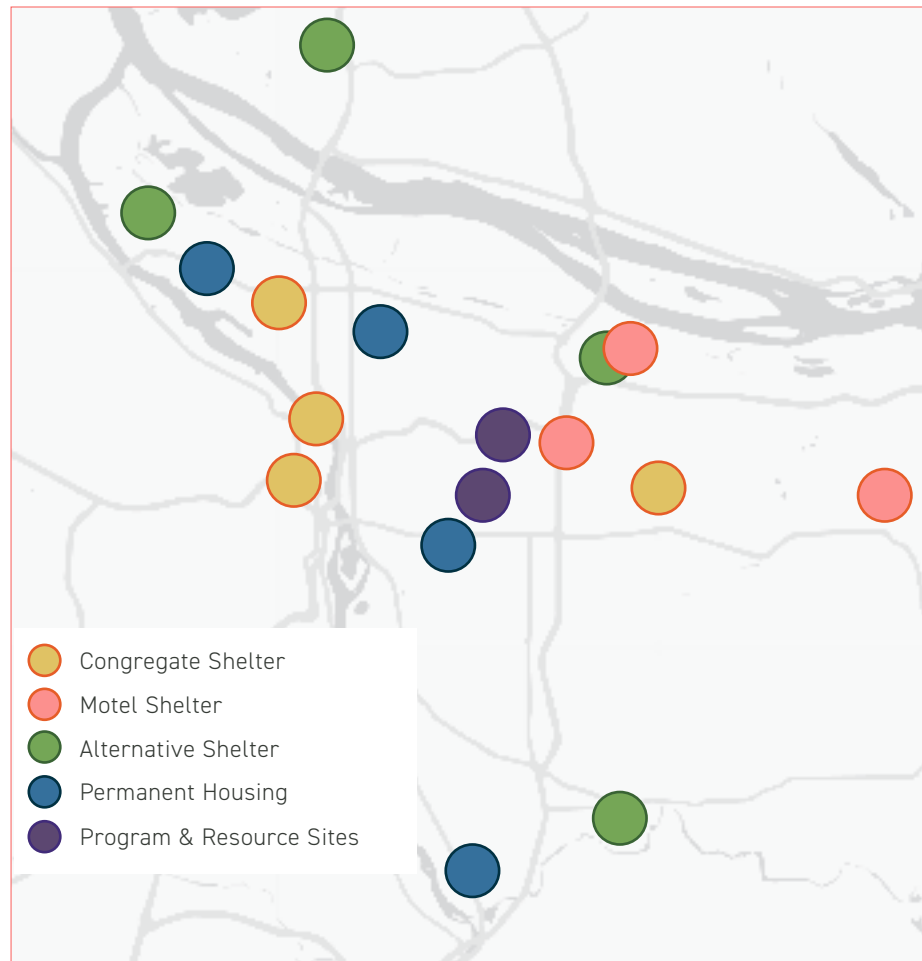

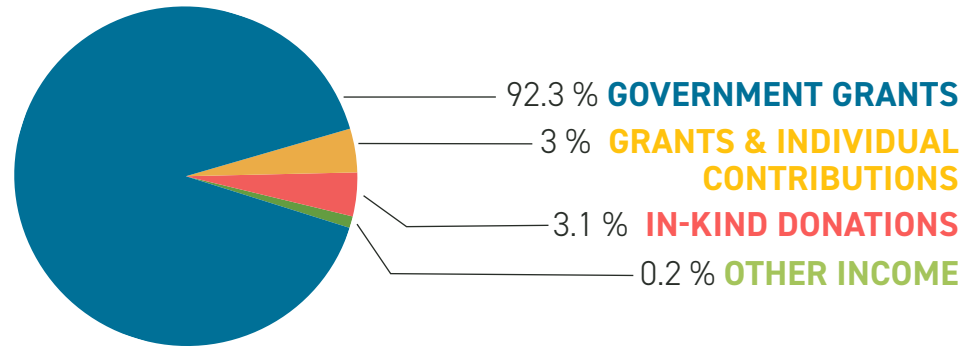

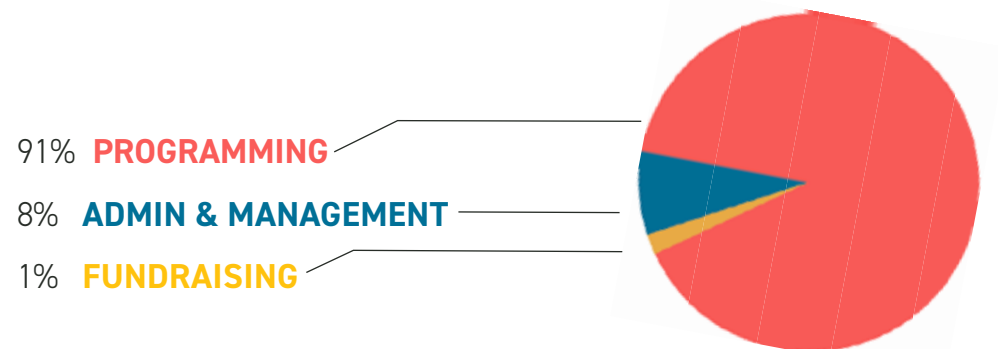
