Rising medicine costs leave chronic and common illnesses dangerously untreated.

The Challenge Facing Vulnerable Nigerians

Thousands of elderly people and orphaned children struggle to access basic medicines and healthcare. Rising medicine costs reduce accessibility, and chronic illnesses like hypertension and diabetes as well as common infections like malaria often go untreated, causing preventable suffering and death.



Project Goal

Improve health and quality of life of vulnerable elderly people and orphaned children through free medicines, medical consultations, community health visits, and referral support.

Project Objectives

- * **Free Medicines**
Provide free essential medicines to elderly and orphaned children in need.
- * **Chronic Disease Care**
Support treatment for chronic diseases including hypertension and diabetes.
- * **Common Illnesses**
Treat malaria, respiratory infections, and bacterial infections.

- * **Medical Outreach**
Conduct community medical outreach programs across Nigerian communities.
- * **Home Visits**
Provide home visits for elderly beneficiaries who cannot travel for care.
- * **Referral & Education**
Refer patients needing specialist care and educate on medication use and healthy living.



Key Project Activities

- * Medicines Procurement**
Purchase quality essential medicines from licensed and certified suppliers.
- * Medical Outreach**
Organize free medical outreach programs in communities across Nigeria.
- * Health Screenings**
Conduct blood pressure, blood sugar, and malaria testing and treatment.

- * Medicine Distribution**
Distribute prescribed medicines to elderly and orphaned beneficiaries.
- * Home Visits**
Visit homebound elderly beneficiaries unable to travel to health centres.
- * Patient Monitoring**
Monitor long-term patients and maintain medical records for follow-up care.



Target Beneficiaries

Our project reaches the most vulnerable members of Nigerian communities who lack access to essential medicines and healthcare.

- Elderly women and men.
- Orphaned children without healthcare access
- Persons living with chronic illnesses
- Individuals with disabilities
- Low-income households.



Expected Results

* Medicines Access

Increased access to life-saving medicines for elderly and orphaned children.

* Chronic Illness

Reduced untreated chronic illnesses and improved management of hypertension and diabetes.

* Elderly Health

Improved physical health and daily functioning of elderly beneficiaries.

* Infections

Reduced complications from malaria and common infections in the community.

* Children's Care

Improved healthcare access and outcomes for orphaned children across Nigeria.

* Admissions

Reduced avoidable hospital admissions through early treatment and preventive care.





Monitoring & Evaluation

Tracking our impact through rigorous accountability and documentation:

- * Number of beneficiaries treated and medicines distributed across all outreach points.
- * Records of community outreach programs, home visits, and patient follow-up documentation.
- * Financial accountability reports, photographic field evidence, and regular updates shared with supporters.

Sustainability Approach

Our project is built for long-term impact. Community volunteers, healthcare workers, local clinics, and leaders collaborate to identify and follow up with beneficiaries. Partnerships with healthcare providers strengthen service delivery, while continued public donations maintain the medicine supply and outreach programs.

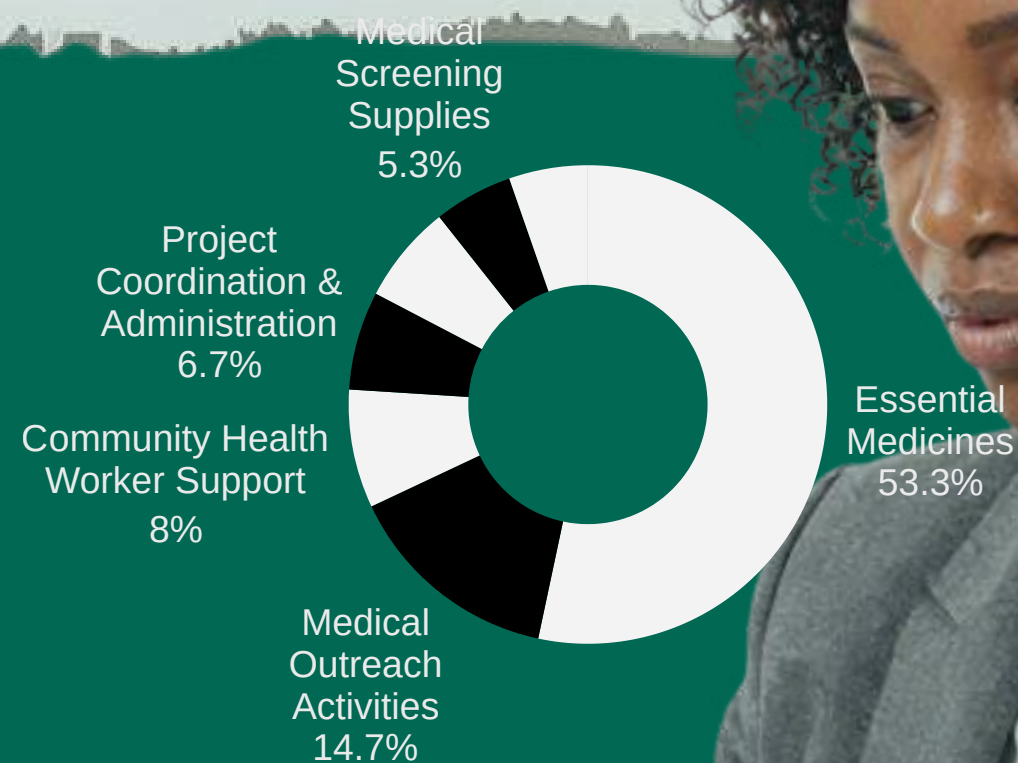

Project Budget Overview

- Total Budget: \$150,000 USD
- Essential Medicines: \$80,000
 - Medical Outreach: \$22,000
 - Project Coordination: \$10,000
 - Home Visits & Transport: \$10,000
 - Health Worker Support: \$12,000
 - Screening Supplies: \$8,000
 - Monitoring & Documentation: \$8,000
