1. Executive Summary

The *Girls Home School of Knowledge Sponsorship Project* is a specialized initiative by TAJPI Tanzania designed to provide individualized and group sponsorships for girls and young women aged 14-24 who have survived domestic trafficking and sexual exploitation. Currently, 50 survivors are enrolled in this transformative 18-month program, which offers foundational education, vocational training, psychosocial care, and structured reintegration support.

This proposal seeks committed sponsors to fund the comprehensive needs of each girl, ensuring their safety, recovery, and empowerment. With targeted sponsorship, these young women can access life-changing opportunities and rebuild their futures with dignity and hope.

2. Problem Statement

Despite being rescued from trafficking and abuse, many survivors in Tanzania are left without long-term support, leaving them vulnerable to re-trafficking and continued exploitation. TAJPI's holistic rehabilitation program addresses these critical needs—but ongoing funding limitations threaten the continuity and scalability of our impact.

Sponsorship provides a sustainable and personal solution. By matching each girl with a dedicated sponsor, we ensure consistent access to services that promote healing, growth, and reintegration.

3. Project Goals and Objectives

Goal:

To provide comprehensive support for 50 survivors of trafficking and harassment through individualized sponsorship that facilitates healing, education, and reintegration.

Objectives:

- Secure full or partial sponsorships for 50 enrolled beneficiaries.
- Guarantee access to vocational training, healthcare, nutrition, and psychosocial services.
- Provide reintegration kits to help graduates start businesses or gain employment.
- Foster meaningful connections between sponsors and beneficiaries through regular updates and communication.

4. Target Group

This project serves girls and young women aged 14-24 who have survived domestic trafficking and sexual violence. Most come from underserved rural or pastoralist backgrounds with limited access to education, vocational skills, or mental health support. The sponsorship model is designed to guide these survivors toward full rehabilitation, self-reliance, and reintegration into their communities.

5. Sponsorship Benefits

Each sponsorship ensures access to the following services:

- **Education & Vocational Training** – Literacy, numeracy, and marketable skills
- **Basic Needs Support** – Meals, hygiene items, clothing, and personal essentials
- **Healthcare & Psychosocial Services** – Medical attention, trauma counseling, and emotional support
- **Business Startup Support** – Reintegration kits (e.g., sewing machines, cooking tools)
- **Ongoing Mentorship & Monitoring** – Continued support beyond graduation

6. Sponsorship Model

We offer flexible sponsorship packages to meet donor capacity:

7. Expected Outcomes

- **50 girls** complete a full cycle of education, healing, and skills training
- **30 small businesses** launched with reintegration kits
- **Improved physical and mental well-being** for all beneficiaries
- **High reintegration success rates**, with reduced risk of re-trafficking
