LILIMA HIGH SCHOOL

Serving students with unique challenges, abilities and learning needs, Lilima High School opened in 2017, initially serving 22 adolescent students in a temporary location. Lilima has grown to serve many more students in a permanent location—a pioneer in their community and country of Eswatini where education opportunities for children with disabilities are sparse—and serves as the second international school in Eswatini and one of the very few Montessori High schools in Southern Africa. Thanks to the support of our donors and dedicated grant liaisons, MGGF has helped Lilima in their prioritized goal to operate their school with Montessori-trained staff. When faced with the obstacle of insufficient funding to train one of their teachers, we were able to help Lilima find new solutions and, with an additional grant, to enable training for four of their staff, with two earning diplomas and the other two earning certificates, all within the same cohort of teachers. We are thrilled to serve as an ongoing support to enhance Lilima's growth into an exceptional learning community.

UNIDAS PARA VIVIR MEJOR

UPAVIM (Unidas Para Vivir Mejor) is a grassroots organization dedicated to empowering the community of La Esperanza, Guatemala, through education and economic opportunity. Founded in 1988 by a group of determined women, UPAVIM has evolved into a key community organization that addresses the urgent threats of poverty, violence, and social isolation facing the residents of La Esperanza and surrounding areas. One way they are addressing the needs in their community is through Montessori education. They are sending one of their teachers to acquire her AMI Elementary guide diploma, after which she will coordinate and facilitate Montessori implementation, providing training to other teachers at the school and leading parent workshops.

Through a transformational gift, MGGF will support UPAVIM in their aim to provide well-trained Montessori teachers to ensure high-quality education from infancy through 6th grade.

WHY IT MATTERS

Although access to formal education worldwide has vastly improved over the last century, the last few decades has seen a flat-line of growth. Why? I believe this is because these are the most marginalized and difficult-to-reach children in the world. The numbers are staggering: recent estimates indicate that 258 million children worldwide are not attending school, and that by the year 2030, 63% of the world's children will be living in the countries with the lowest access to education.

While some institutions and organizations strive to insert formal schooling opportunities in remote locations, we recognize that the greatest strengths lie in the community itself—where self-determined application brings the highest likelihood of long-lasting impact for children and families.

At MGGF, we recognize that community-driven Montessori programs are the best way to reach children where they are at in culturally-appropriate ways. The greatest changes in society happen in small but meaningful ways by individuals and communities who are determined and passionate about serving where they are planted.

Montessori education is uniquely positioned to serve children where they are at, in holistic ways to prepare them for their unique circumstances with a life that they value. That's why we support communities in their own settings and with their self-initiated projects, to enhance their work to provide Montessori education to children in their community.
