I- PROJECT SITUATION AND IMPACT



During the reporting period (*November 1, 2025 to February 28, 2026*), the project has continued to generate a significant impact on users of CEPROSH's Comprehensive Care Services. Progress achieved in the previous quarter (*August 1 to October 31, 2025*) has been followed up, while key strategies have been strengthened to improve retention in care and adherence to HIV treatment.

Donations received in recent months have been primarily allocated to transportation support, prioritizing individuals facing the greatest barriers to accessing healthcare services, whether due to living in remote geographic areas or being unemployed.

One of the most notable achievements has been the sustained follow-up of 78 people living with HIV (PLHIV) who had previously been re-engaged after treatment interruption. Through community visits, active monitoring, and continuous support, adherence to antiretroviral therapy has been strengthened, while also ensuring timely interventions in response to physical and mental health situations that could put their continuity in care at risk.

Strengthening home-based care across various communities has been a central component of the strategy, bringing services closer to the most vulnerable individuals and improving the quality of support provided. This approach has helped build greater trust in the healthcare system, reduce treatment dropout, and foster a closer relationship between the healthcare team and service users.

Overall, the project has contributed to consolidating a comprehensive, humane, and continuous model of care, reaffirming CEPROSH's commitment to improving the quality of life of people living with HIV. In this context, efforts will continue to expand the project's reach to achieve the goal of providing care to 150 people living with HIV in the country.
