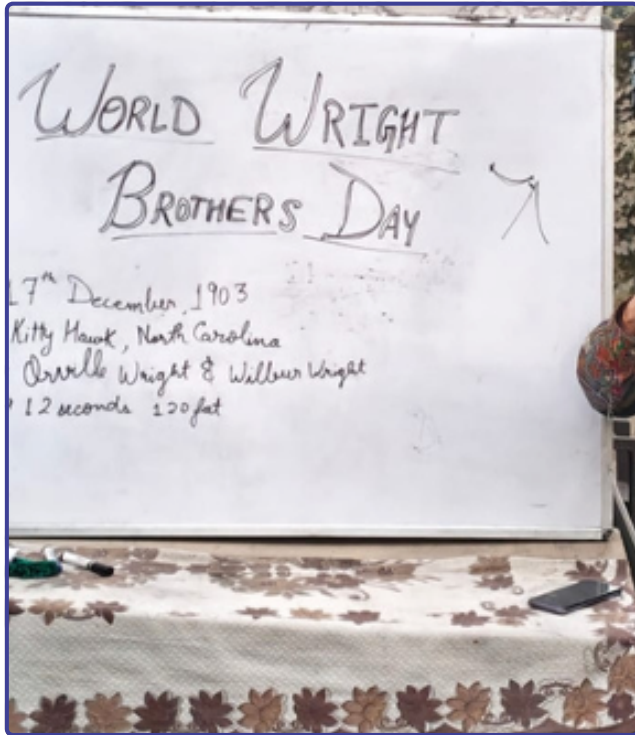

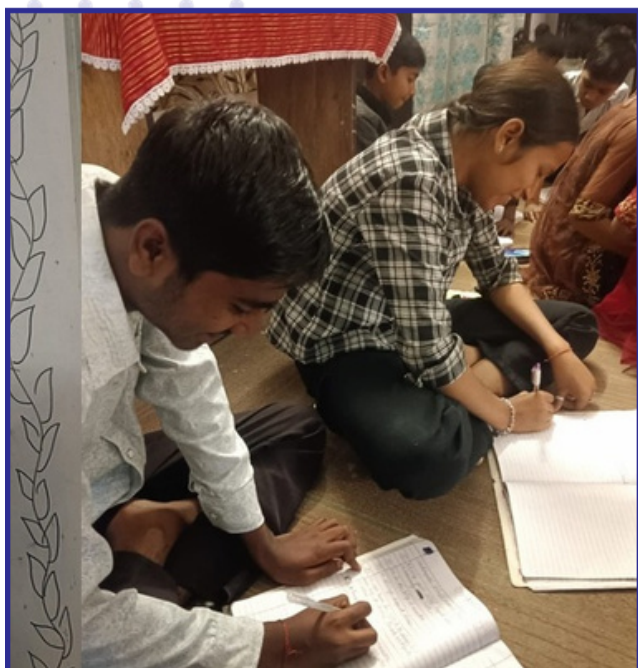


Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Jayanti
