There is still some existing use of rudimentary products like sand in polythene bags, old mattresses, and banana fibre. There continues to be less male involvement, with some girls totally not sharing about their menses with their fathers, stemming from cultural taboos. There is still a gap in awareness and literacy, as the people meant to give the right information do not have it.
