

PAKISTAN FLOODS - 2025 SITUATION REPORT



SITUATION OVERVIEW

Worsening monsoon conditions continue to devastate Pakistan, with heavy rains, flash floods, and landslides causing widespread damage nationwide. The death toll is now **805** since late June 2025. Over **1,100** people are injured, while **7,828** homes have been destroyed.

Punjab has been placed on high alert, with over **200,000** people evacuated from vulnerable areas due to rising water levels in the Sutlej, Ravi, and Chenab rivers Meanwhile, in the northern regions, continued downpours, flash floods, and landslides have severely impacted communities, with access hampered by washed-out roads and collapsed infrastructure.

The Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) warns of continued heavy rainfall through late August 2025, with heightened risks of flash floods and landslides. Authorities urge strict vigilance and compliance with evacuation protocols in high-risk areas.

According to the Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD), Widespread rain-wind/thundershower (with scattered heavy falls at times very heavy) is expected in Islamabad/Rawalpindi, Murree, Galliyat, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Lahore, Kasur, Sheikhupura, Sialkot, Narowal, Mianwali, Khushab, Sargodha, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Nankana Sahib, Chiniot, Faisalabad and Sahiwal. Landslides/mudslides may cause roads closure in the vulnerable hilly areas of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Gilgit-Baltistan, Murree, Galliyat and Kashmir during the forecast period. More rains with wind/thundershower from August 29 to September 2, 2025 are forecasted with occasional gaps. Public are advice to remain cautious.

PDMA PUNJAB ISSUES FLOOD ALERT

PDMA Punjab has issued a high-level flood alert as the eighth spell of monsoon rains continues until **September 2, 2025**. The Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala is flowing at around **261,000** cusecs, while the Ravi at Jassar is near **166,500** cusecs. Over **200,000** people have been evacuated from low-lying areas, with army support deployed in eight districts, Lahore, Okara, Faisalabad, Sialkot, Narowal, Kasur, Sargodha and Hafizabad to reinforce ongoing rescue and relief operations. The situation has worsened after India released more water into the Sutlej, increasing flood risks. Authorities confirm at least **15 deaths** in Punjab, warning that the situation may get worse in the coming days due to heavy rains and rising river flows.

ARMY DEPLOYED AS FLOOD THREAT ESCALATES IN PUNJAB

The **Pakistan Army** has been called in to assist the civil administration after India released water into the Ravi and Sutlej rivers, sharply raising water levels and increasing flood risks. Troops have been deployed in **eight** districts of **Punjab** To support ongoing efforts. **Rescue 1122**, Civil Defence, and police teams are actively engaged in evacuation, rescue, and relief operations to protect vulnerable communities.
